

Aims of the Course:

History 324 is an upper division history course that introduces students to some of the major events, themes, developments and individuals that marked Europe during the twentieth century. In this course, topics include the causes and impact of two world wars, the Holocaust, post-war occupation and reconstruction, the Cold War, decolonization, protest movements, the collapse of communism, mass media, the "European community" and contesting definitions of what constitutes "Europe." Some of the major questions that we will focus on include:

General "smart reading" tips

- 4. Do not get lost in the details! Focus on the major questions and themes for the week.
- 5. Interact with the text: annotate, jot down questions/problems, sticky notes, main themes, reactions or print out reading questions with space to take notes.


