Next Week's Opponents:

<u>Hawaii Pacific University</u> – The Sea Warriors are one of four contenders for the PacWest crown this year. They are 12-6 overall and 2-2 in the conference so far and will play 10 more games before the Yellowjackets come calling next week. The Jackets won three of four games against HPU last year, but the Sea Warriors finished their trip to Billings with a 17-3 shellacking of the Jackets at Cenex Stadium. MSUB is 1-9 all-time at HPU.

Neither Rain, nor Sleet, nor Snow.....nor Wind, nor Cold, nor Blue Hawks:

The Yellowjackets faced almost every element on Sunday, defeating Dickinson State 9-1 in six innings to win their home opener at Cenex Stadium. About the only thing Mother Nature didn't throw at the Jackets—and a nice sized crowd of 80-plus hearty softball fans—was sunshine. A half hour before the scheduled 1:30 start time, the field was entirely covered in snow and the white stuff was still falling. Fifteen minutes later the snow had stopped and the warm ground from last week's warm temps melted the snow and absorbed the water.

For a game that ended via the eight-run rule, the Jackets' win over the Blue Hawks began as a well played pitchers' duel. MSUB's Joey Ehnes and DSU's Erin Brinkman were nearly untouchable for over half the game. The Jackets finally broke through on Brinkman with a pair of runs in the bottom of the fifth, and the Blue Hawks were able to manufacture a run in the top of the sixth against Ehnes. MSUB's high-powered offense came to life in the bottom of the sixth, sparked by home runs from Theresa Campbell and Rachel Quarnburg.

Welcome Home:

Rachel Quarnburg is no stranger to Billings softball fans. The sophomore transfer from Colorado State-Pueblo won a State Championship with Billings Senior HS as a senior and was named to the all-state first team as a pitcher. Following an injury plagued couple years in Pueblo, Quarnburg transferred back home to Billings, where coach Jeff Aumend welcomed her with open arms. While she has thrown just 3 1/3 innings this season, Quarnburg has been an impact player for the Yellowjackets with her bat. She has started 17 games and is batting a conference-best .500 in 42 at bats. She also leads the team with 16 RBI and a .638 on base percentage.

These Shoes Are Made for Walking:

In 55 games last season, the Yellowjackets drew a grand total of 93 walks. Through the first 18 games of this year, they have already walked 61 times. While coach Aumend will admit he loves all the home runs the Jackets hit, he likes them better when there are runners on base. The improved discipline at the plate has led to a team batting average of .297 and an on base percentage of .381. Last year the Jackets had a team on base percentage of .307 and only three players accumulated more than 10 walks all season. This year Quarnburg has already drawn 13 walks (that would have been third on the team last year), and fellow power hitters Campbell and Layne Pavey have eight and nine walks respectively.

Where You Running to?:

With two stolen bases on Sunday against Dickinson, the Yellowjackets have already matched last year's season total of 12 stolen bases. Both steals on Sunday were the result of heads up base running by Ehnes and Campbell, catching the Blue Hawk battery off guard between plays. Even though they weren't the traditional stolen bases, beating the throw with speed, the Jackets are obviously taking a more aggressive approach on the base paths this season.

Rim-Rattling Not a Thing of the Past:

Despite the record pace for walks and stolen bases, the 2005 Yellowjackets will still be known for hitting the long ball. Last season they ranked 23rd in NCAA Division II for home runs per game at 0.58. They're not far off that pace this year at 0.56, and they have played just one game in the friendly confines of Cenex Stadium where the ball is seemingly drawn to the Rimrocks that rise above the outfield fence. After a road swing that stretches from March 24 to April 3, MSU-Billings will return to Cenex Stadium for its final 16 games of the regular season.

Yellowjacket Coaching Staff



Jeff Aumend is in his fifth season at the helm of the Yellowjacket program that he built from the ground beginning in 2000. At MSU-Billings, Aumend has again taken a program from scratch and made it competitive in just a few years. The Yellowjackets won 18 of their last 24 games, last year, to finish just one game below .500 at 27-28. The 2004 season was full of highlights as they led the Pacific West Conference in home runs and had six players named all-conference with two of those also being named all-region. A 53-92 overall record for the program is deceptive as the Jackets have increased, progressively, from 2 wins in 2001 to 9 (2002), 15 (2003) and 27, last season.

Aumend, a native of Alliance, Ohio, started the NCAA Division II women's softball program at Queens College in Charlotte, North Carolina in 1994 and served as its first and only Head Women's Softball Coach until he moved to Billings in September of 2000 to start the MSU-Billings softball program. In his

seven years at Queens College, Aumend achieved a 155-132 record with a 100% graduation rate among his student-athletes. In Aumend's first season at Queens College (1993-94), the Royals posted a 26-17 record. More recently, in the 1997 season, the Royals went 32-13 and finished the season ranked fourth in the South Atlantic Region. Aumend earned his 200th career victory last season and has an eleven-year career record of 208-224. A respected hitting coach, his 1998 team at Queens finished fourth in the nation in team batting average at .372 and last year's MSU-Billings finished 23rd in the nation home runs with 32.

MSU-Billings competes in the Pacific West Conference, which includes four schools in Hawaii and one in New Mexico. MSU-Billings is the first four-year institution in Montana to offer women's softball. Aumend received a Bachelor of Science degree in Communication Arts from Defiance College (Ohio). He currently serves on the NCAA Division II "Top 25" poll committee and is the former National Chairperson for Education/Publications for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).
