Season Preview

First-year coach Kim Lemmens inherits a relatively young squad that is very similar to last year's team that went 20-31. The Yellowjackets will rely heavily upon a large class of sophomores, including three of their four pitchers. Terina Stacks, Lisa Moore, and Rebekah Tsatsa combined for all but two of the team's 320 innings pitched last season. Moore logged the most innings with 128, posting an 8-13 record. Stacks and Tsatsa came on in the second half of the season, combining for 10 of the team's last 14 wins. Stacks led the team with a 3.62 ERA and posted a 6-10 record. Tsatsa had the best winning percentage of the three pitchers, going 6-8. Freshman Lindsey Trenary is also expected to become a productive member of the pitching staff.

The Jackets return two players who batted over .300 last season. Junior Jenna Haacke hit .301 and blasted 10 home runs. Sophomore Stephanie Gosselin hit .370 in 31 games. Defensively, the Yellow-jackets will rely on playing solid defense behind their young pitchers. Lemmens says that fall and spring practices have created good competition for starting spots in both the infield and outfield. The emphasis in her first season has been on fundamentals and situational awareness.

Catcher Aysha Maddox will be joined by Megan Moeller, Lorel Palmer, and Jenna McCartney as the seniors on the team. Along with juniors Frank, Haacke, and Schaapveld, the Yellowjackets will have seven upperclassmen to help the younger players learn the ropes.

MSUB opens the season with a week's worth of games in Phoenix, including an appearance at the Schutt Sports Division II Leadoff Classic. Following the Phoenix trip, the Yellowjackets will make their annual pilgrimage to Washington for the Central Washington Invitational on March 1-4. The tournament will give the Yellowjackets a sneak peak at their future conference foes in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference. The Yellowjackets are scheduled to open the home schedule the week after the Central Washington tournament, hosting University of Mary for a doubleheader on March 7.

After the double-dip with Mary, the Yellowjackets open Heartland Conference play in earnest starting with a 14-game trip to Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas. A dozen of those games will be conference games. The Yellowjackets come off the road to play 12 of their next 14 games at home. Eight of those are conference counters against two of the best teams in the Heartland. St. Mary's, a perennial NCAA Tournament participant, visits Cenex Stadium on April 5 and 6. Incarnate Word, the defending Heartland champion and preseason conference favorite, comes calling April 13 and 14.

MSUB will make one more trip to Texas for the Heartland Conference Tournament, April 26-28 in San Antonio. All six teams in the Heartland will attend the tournament. In a recent poll of league coaches and sports information directors, MSUB was picked to finish fourth in the six-team league.

Kim Lemmens was hired as the third head softball coach in school history on May 30, 2006. Most recently Lemmens was the first assistant coach at Fort Hays State University in Hays, Kansas. Before her one season at Fort Hays State, Lemmens was the pitching coach at Colorado State University for four years. At CSU, Lemmens helped two pitchers earn All-Mountain West honors. The Rams won two Mountain West titles during Lemmens's four years with the program. Lemmens is originally from Denmark, Wisconsin. She was a pitcher for four years at University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, an NCAA Division III school. She helped Wisconsin-Whitewater to two conference championships and three NCAA Tournament appearances.



Cori Thiermann is in her first season as an assistant coach at MSU-Billings. She is a 2006 graduate of University of Wisconsin-Green Bay where she was a varsity letter winner from 2002 to 2005. Last year she was a student assistant coach at UW-Green Bay. As a senior Thiermann batted .224 in 31 games to help the Phoenix win the Horizon League title and advance to the NCAA Division I Tournament for the first time in school history. UW-Green Bay upset sixth-ranked Oregon State in the first round of that tournament for its first-ever win over a ranked opponent.
