

### Lady Yellowjacket Basketball 2003-2004

#### This Week's Opponents:

Sonoma State Seawolves – The Yellowjackets and Seawolves have become West Region rivals over the past couple years, with SSU winning the last two match-ups, including a first round NCAA Tournament game in 2002. The Seawolves return Jessica Jones (6-0 Jr.), who averaged 14.6 points and 5.9 rebounds per game last season. Tara Whiteside (5-10 Jr.) averaged 13.0 ppg and was named second team All-CCAA. SSU beat MSUB 63-44 last season in the Lady Jackets' worst offensive game of the year. Jones scored a game-high 15 points and Whiteside added 12, including 5-of-6 from the free throw line.

<u>Central Washington Wildcats</u> – With last year's 91-69 runaway win in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the Yellowjackets improved their all-time record against the Wildcats to 9-1. The 91 points was the most scored by MSUB all season, and freshman point guard Jenny Langford handed out a career-high seven assists. CWU returns Lindsay Weiss (5-9 Sr.) and Alayna Vincent (6-1 Jr.), who each averaged double figures last season. Weiss scored 15 against the Jackets in the tournament and Vincent had nine points, 11 rebounds and four blocked shots.

<u>Seattle Pacific Falcons</u> – The Falcons ended MSUB's season last year with an 86-70 win in the regional semifinals. SPU was unbeaten and ranked No. 1 in the nation for the entire season before losing in the regional championship game to Cal State-Bakersfield. The Falcons return Valerie Gustafson (6-0 Sr.) and Michelle Beaumont (5-11 Jr.) but lost three seniors to graduation who all averaged double figures. SPU was ranked No. 22 in the WBCA Preseason Poll.

The Yellowjackets have dominated the series with the Wildcats, including a 22-point win in the NCAA Tournament last year. MSUB's only loss was 75-63 on Nov. 30, 2000 in Ellensburg.

Seattle Pacific: 15-11

The Falcons are one of the Jackets' biggest West Region rivals, dating back to their days in the PacWest Conference. SPU has won the last two meetings and the teams are an even 3-3 since 2000. The Yellowjackets are 4-10 all-time against the Falcons in Seattle, but have lost six in a row.

#### Last Week's Highlights:

The Lady Jackets held a Blue-Gold scrimmage last Saturday in their final tune-up for the regular season. Kayla Frize scored a game-high 25 points in her first live action since having reconstructive knee surgery last year. She was 7-of-13 from 3-point range and also had four assists with no turnovers.

In all, eight different players scored double figures in the game, with Robyn Milne and Sophia Forney notching double-doubles. Milne scored 17 on 7-of-17 shooting and pulled down 12 boards. Forney scored 10 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

Along with Frize, three Yellowjacket newcomers lit up the scoreboard from behind the arc. Freshman Shannon Harvey was 4-of-8 from long range and finished with 14 points. Jenny Auer and Jamie Barker each hit three 3-pointers.

#### Notes:

Robyn Milne, a junior from Richey, MT, was named the Lady Jackets' team captain last week in a November-style team election. Milne is the only upperclassman returning from season. Sophomore Jenny Langford from Reedpoint, MT was selected as the co-captain.

## Lady Yellowjacket Coaches

**Melissa Slone (1<sup>st</sup> year):** Slone joins the Yellowjackets after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at College of Charleston, a Division I school in South Carolina. Slone is a native of Fort Thomas, Kentucky, where she graduated from Highlands High School in 1987. In 1986 she became the school's all-time scoring leader with 1,604 career points before going on to star at Northern Kentucky University, a perennial Division II basketball power. She was a three-year starter at point guard, leading the Norse to an 88-23 record. Northern Kentucky captured three Great Lakes Valley Conference titles and qualified for the NCAA tournament four times in Slone's four years at the school. She graduated in 1991 with a degree in accounting.

**Julie Moehring (1<sup>st</sup> year):** Moehring was formerly an assistant coach at College of Mount St. Joseph, a Division III school in Cincinnati. In addition to her coaching duties, she will also work part time in the Yellowjackets' Marketing and Development Office. Moehring was an NCAA II Kodak All-American for Northern Kentucky in 1987-88 after leading the Norse to their third straight NCAA Tournament. In her junior season, Moehring led NKU to the NCAA II Final Four. At College of Mount St. Joseph last season, Moehring helped the Lions reach their first NCAA Tournament in school history. She coached guards and assisted in recruiting, travel and fundraising.
