Last Week's Highlights:

The Yellowjackets won two big West Region road games last week, sweeping Alaska-Anchorage and Alaska-Fairbanks at Anchorage's Glacier Classic. Robyn Milne was named the tournament's most outstanding player and Tanya Petersen was named to the all-tournament team.

The victories pushed the Lady Jackets back to the .500 mark at 5-5 before their nine-day holiday break. Both Anchorage and Fairbanks have winning records so far, and if they can stay above .500 it will help the Yellowjackets in the regional polls.

While neither Alaska school may be a tournament caliber team this season, playing them on their home courts is always difficult. Fairbanks entered the tournament at 6-0 and Anchorage came in at 5-1. The Yellowjackets swept the Seawolves and Nanooks in Alaska for the third time in the last four trips.

In the win over host Anchorage, Petersen scored a career-high 21 points and had eight rebounds. She was 8-of-12 from the field (66.7%) and a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line. After her outstanding weekend in Alaska, Petersen is now second on the team for scoring (11.5 ppg), rebounding (6.4 rpg) and assists (1.8 apg).

Milne netted 14 points to go with 11 rebounds against the Seawolves. She made 7-of-11 from the field (63.6%) and also blocked four shots. Petersen and Milne accounted for nearly 57 percent of the Yellowjackets' offense against UAA and 51 percent of their rebounds.

In Saturday's game against Fairbanks, the Yellowjackets controlled the Nanooks from the opening tip to the final buzzer. MSU-Billings held Fairbanks to just 17 points in the first half on 24 percent field goal shooting. Meanwhile, the Yellowjackets were continuing their best shooting weekend of the season, connecting on 53 percent of their shots in the first half.

Last Week's Highlights Continued:

Five different players scored double figures for the Yellowiackets against the Nanooks, led by Jenny Langford's 18. She was 6-of-10 from the field and 4-of-5 from 3-point range. Langford has been red hot at times from behind the arc this season. She has set top ten single game marks for 3-point percentage in three different games, with all three also qualifying as top ten single game marks for 3pointers made.

Petersen finished with another solid game: 15 points, five rebounds, four assists, two blocked shots, one steal. She was 6-of-7 from the line, finishing the tournament 11-of-12. Of the Yellowjackets with at least 20 free throw attempts this season, Petersen's 77.8% is second on the team behind Langford's 90.9%.

Milne added 14 points and reached career-highs for rebounds and blocked shots. She pulled down 22 rebounds, seven on the offensive end, matching the fifth-best single game mark in school history. She also tied her career-high of six blocked shots, giving her 25 for the season and 125 for her career.

Milne finished her sophomore season ranked 26th in the NCAA for blocked shots per game at 2.0. The first NCAA statistical rankings will be released the week of January 5, and Milne should find herself in the top 20 for blocked shots.

Jenny Auer finished with a career-high 12 points, sinking 2-of-3 shots from behind the arc and connecting on all six of her free throw attempts. Sophia Forney added 10 points and five rebounds.

For the weekend, the Yellowjackets shot 44 percent from the field and 81 percent from the free throw line, moving their season averages to 36 and 70 percent respectively. The hot shooting, something MSUB has been lacking since the opening night win against Sonoma State, also gave the Yellowjackets their first backto-back wins of the season.

Notes:

The Lady Yellowiackets are now halfway through their grueling stretch of ten straight road games. They are 2-3 in those five games, but 2-1 in the all-important West Region games.

The next five games will all be West Region road games, giving MSU-Billings a chance to rebound from its 5-5 start and gain ground in the regional power rankings. The first regional poll is scheduled to be released after the first of the year.

While the Yellowjackets likely won't be in the top ten for the first regional poll, four or five wins in the next five games could position them to make a run at the tournament down the stretch. They are currently 4-3 against regional teams.

Lady Yellowjacket Coaches



Melissa Slone (1st year): Slone joins the Yellowjackets after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at College of Charleston, a Division I school in South Carolina. Slone is a native of Fort Thomas, Kentucky, where she graduated from Highlands High School in 1987. In 1986 she became the school's all-time scoring leader with 1,604 career points before going on to star at Northern Kentucky University, a perennial Division II basketball power. She was a three-year starter at point guard, leading the Norse to an 88-23 record. Northern Kentucky captured three Great Lakes Valley Conference titles and qualified for the NCAA tournament four times in Slone's four years at the school. She graduated in 1991 with a degree in accounting.



Julie Moehring (1st year): Moehring was formerly an assistant coach at College of Mount St. Joseph, a Division III school in Cincinnati. In addition to her coaching duties, she will also work part time in the Yellowjackets' Marketing and Development Office. Moehring was an NCAA II Kodak All-American for Northern Kentucky in 1987-88 after leading the Norse to their third straight NCAA Tournament. In her junior season, Moehring led NKU to the NCAA II Final Four. At College of Mount St. Joseph last season, Moehring helped the Lions reach their first NCAA Tournament in school history. She coached guards and assisted in recruiting, travel and fundraising.
