Book

Author's Surname, Author's Initials. (Year). *Book title*. Place of Publication: Publisher's Name.

Bader, L. A. (1980). *Reading diagnosis and remediation in classroom and clinic*. New York: Macmillan.

Article, Chapter, Short Story, Poem, etc., in an Edited Book

Author's Surname, Author's Initials. (Year). Title of article. In Editor's Name (Ed.), *Book title* (edition, pages). Place of Publication: Publisher's Name. [Note: Do not invert the editor's name; use initials and surname]

Bader, L. A. (1980). Reading diagnosis and remediation in classroom and clinic. In H. L. Pick Jr., P. V. Broek, & D.C. Knill (Eds.), *Cognition: Conceptual and methodological issues* (pp. 51-84). New York: Macmillan.

Journal Article, One Author

Author's Surname, Author's Initials. (Year, Month Day). Title of article. *Journal Title*, volume number(issue), page(s).

Bader, L. A. (2001, Fall). Certification requirements in reading: A trend. *Journal of Reading*, 17(3), 115-121.

Journal Article, Two Authors

1st Author's Surname, 1st Author's Initials, & 2nd Author's Surname, 2nd Author's Initials. (Year, Month Day). Title of article. *Journal Title*, volume number(issue number), page(s).

Bader, L. A., & Pearce, D. L. (2003, December). Content area reading preparation: Effectiveness of four methods of instruction. *Reading Horizon*, 23(12), 25-29.

Newspaper Article, No Author

Title of article. (Year, Month Day). *Newspaper Title*, page(s).

Fun in the sun. (2000, April 1). *Miami Times*, pp. A3, A4-A7.

Reference Works- No Author

Title of entry. (Year). *Title (Vol., pp.)*, Publication Place: Publisher's Name.

Relativity. (2000). *The new encyclopedia Britannica* (Vol. 26, pp. 501-508). Chicago: Encyclopedia Britannica.

Reports

Organization. (Year). *Title* (Report number). Publication Place: Publisher's Name.

National Institute of Mental Health. (2000). *Clinical training in serious mental illnesses* (DHHS Publication No. ADM 90-1679). Washington, DC: U.S. Government Printing Office.

Note: The "References" page is double-spaced, and entries are alphabetized by first word and indented using a "hanging indent." Features demonstrated on this page may be "mixed and matched" to fit a given situation. For example, two authors for a book would be no different from two authors for a journal article.
