### Book

Author's Surname, Author's First Name (as it appears on the title page). *Book Title*. City of Publication: Publisher's Name, Year. Print.

Laribbe, Jonathan L. *Killing Time in Mexico: How I Spent My Senior Year of College*. Portland: Backwoods, 1996. Print.

### A Scholarly Edition (Book): work prepared by someone other than an author: by an Editor

Author's Surname, Author's First Name. *Title of Book*. Ed. Name of Editor. City of Publication: Publisher's Name, Year. Print.

Austin, Jane. *Sense and Sensibility*. Ed. Claudia Johnson. New York: Norton, 2001. Print.

### Anonymous Piece in a Multivolume Work with an Editor

"Name of the piece." *Name of the Book*. Ed. Name of Editor. # ed. # vols. City of Publication: Publisher's Name, Year. Print.

"Living in Italy." *Essays on Travel*. Ed. Jerry Brush. 3 vols. New York: Aero, 1998. Print.

### An article in a Scholarly Journal

Author's Surname, Author's First Name. "Title of the Article." *Journal Title* Volume.Issue (Year): Page(s). Print.

Holt, James. "Tuberculosis: An Old Enemy." *Medicine Today* 17.2 (1994): 348-56. Print.

### An Article in a Newspaper

Author's Surname, Author's First Name. "Title of the Article." *Newspaper Name* Day Month Year, Section: Page(s) (+ if continues onto other pages). Print.

Jeromack, Paul. "This Once, a David of the Art World Does Goliath a Favor." *New York Times* 13 July 2002, late ed.: B7+. Print.

### Monthly Magazine Article with Three Authors

1st Author's Surname, 1st Author's First Name, 2nd Author's Full Name, and 3rd Author's Full Name. "Title of Article." *Journal Title* Month Year: Pages. Print.

Adendron, Phil, Point Setta, and Venus Flitrop. "Plant Care throughout the Centuries." *Foliage Today* June 1997: 42-56. Print.
