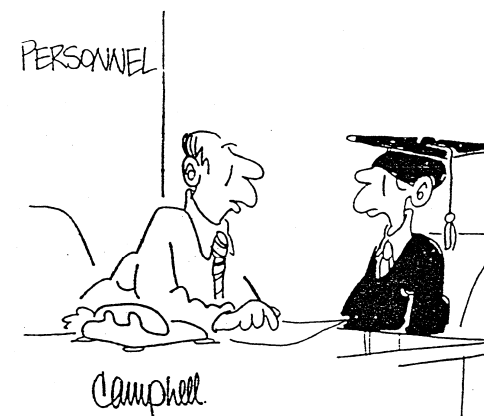

## HELPING YOUR STUDENT MAKE GOOD CAREER DECISIONS

We know most parents want their students to get a good education AND get a good job after graduation!

### DO YOU KNOW?

Students who make career choices stay in school and graduate faster than students who remain “undecided.”

Students who use Career Services find jobs faster, are more likely employed in their degree field, and have higher starting wages at graduation.

Here's recent grad data:

#### **Class of 2009**

**92% of MSU Billings grads** responding to an annual survey found employment **within 6-12 months** of graduation, or they continued education in graduate or professional schools.

#### **Class of 2009 BA/BS (4-yr) Degree:**

Average Salary was **\$29,768/year**

- 59%** were employed in **Billings**
- 29%** were employed elsewhere in **MT**
- 12%** were employed **out of state**

#### **Class of 2009 Tech (2-yr) Degree:**

Average Salary was **\$36,255/year**

- 78%** were employed in **Billings**
- 17%** were employed elsewhere in **MT**
- 5%** were employed **out of state**

## SERVICES FOR STUDENTS INCLUDE:

**1 . Career advising.** Professionals help students clarify career goals and identify strategies to achieve them.

**2 . Career assessments & resources.** Gathering objective information about oneself and the world of work is part of the solution. Assessments, books, and Internet resources help students learn about options available to them.

**3 . Jobs!** Most MSU Billings students work while attending college. Local employers advertise hundreds of part-time jobs each year. Students may view them on **CareerLink**, accessible 24/7 during the semesters they are enrolled.

**4 . Cooperative Education internships.** Students are able to “try on” career choices by working in their fields of study. While earning academic credit, most students also earn a salary. Students must have earned at least 24 credits and maintain a 2.0 GPA (3.0 for Business majors) to participate.

**5 . Professional employment.** Career fairs and on-campus recruiting introduce students to employers. Students learn about employers’ expectations, finding internships, and how to network into a “real job” after graduation.

### HOW CAN MY STUDENT PREPARE NOW TO FIND A JOB AFTER GRADUATION?

Now is the time to begin career planning to maximize the college experience. Career Services can help throughout the college experience. Don't let your student wait until the Monday after graduation to say, “I need help finding a job!”

### HOW CAN MY STUDENT LEARN ABOUT CAREER OPTIONS?

Career Services has lots of information about “hot” careers, job search strategies, how to meet employers.

For example, we can connect them with professionals who are in the career students think they'd like to pursue.

An information interview helps students learn what's good—and not so good—about being a (*fill in the blank*) by asking a practitioner.

Planning for an internship experience outside of the classroom adds value to an education and ammunition to a résumé. Employers prefer to hire the “known quantity,” students who have tested their learning in the workplace.
