What is the average annual wage and potential lifetime earnings for professionals working in the Human Service field?

Occupation	Annual wage range in MT*	Potential lifetime earnings**
Licensed Addiction Counselor	\$30,640 - \$59,410	\$48,520 x 39 = \$1,892,280
Mental Health Counselor	\$41,200—\$49,190	\$45,160 x 39 = \$1,761,240
Juvenile Probation Officer	\$47,180 - \$59,130	\$60,250 x 39 = \$2,349,750
Therapeutic Youth Mentor	\$30,640 - \$59,410	\$48,529 x 39 = \$1,892,280

What percentage of Human Service graduates report having a job after graduating?

Out of the 62% of 2022 Human Service graduates that we received grad data on, **100% reported being employed* after graduation.**

HUMAN SERVICES

Overview of the Human Services program:

The Bachelor of Science in Human Services degree at MSU Billings is designed to prepare you for entry-level professional practice in the broad field of human services.

- Program responds to both current and future trends and needs for human resource development
- Flexible curriculum permits students to become well acquainted with the comprehensive spectrum of human and helping services
- Degree provides the information, tools, and skills required of human services professionals
- Emphasis on field experiences clearly reflects the importance given to the application of theory and methodology in applied human interaction

The BS in Human Services is a venerable program that has been preparing professionals for a wide range of positions in the fields of case management and social work-related employment since the 1980s. The program is one of the few in Montana that broadly focuses on the field of human services with concentrations that include serving populations in mental health, disability, and family systems.

Although this degree is meant to prepare most graduates for employment primarily as professionals capable of casework with a diverse population, a concentration in Substance Abuse Counseling was recently to expand their employment opportunities. The addiction counseling emphasis includes addiction assessment and treatment classes to increase the students' knowledge of addiction and their eventual employability in the community.

What makes your program unique?

The field of human services uniquely approaches the objective of meeting human needs through an interdisciplinary knowledge base, focusing on prevention as well as remediation of problems, and maintaining a commitment to improving the overall quality of life of service population. This program focuses on developing the practical skills necessary to make a positive difference for individuals in the community. Students from our program end up working in a variety of positions in residential care, correctional facilities, substance abuse treatment facilities, organizations dedicated to children and families, poverty and employment services, child and elder care operations, mental health agencies, and domestic violence agencies.

- Flexibility. Students can take classes online and in person.
- Students like the opportunity to help others and change their lives. It's fulfilling and challenging work.
