What is the average annual wage and potential lifetime earnings for those working in the Psychology field?

Occupation	Annual wage range in MT*	Potential lifetime earnings**
Behavioral Consultant/Specialist	\$30,640 - \$59,410	\$48,520 x 39 yrs = \$1,892,280
Youth Case Manager	\$29,550 - \$37,610	\$37,610 x 39 yrs = \$1,466,790
