

Nursing (Practical and Registered)

What is a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN)?

Licensed Practical nurses provide nursing care for patients in structured healthcare settings who are experiencing common, well-defined health problems. In their roles as members of the discipline of nursing, LPN's actively participate in and subscribe to the legal and ethical tenants of the discipline. LPN's provide care under the supervision of registered nurses, physicians, osteopaths, podiatrist, or dentists. They participate in data collection, communicate information within the chain of command, and implement nursing interventions based on established care plans. LPN roles are defined by the state they are practicing in.

What is an Associate Science Registered Nurse (ASN)?

The role of the Associate of Science Registered Nurse is to provide direct care to clients, individual, or groups, in a variety of structured settings with clear policies and procedures. The ASN is prepared to prioritize care by assessing the evolving needs of individuals, groups and families. The ASN utilizes critical thinking to modify the nursing plan of care. They manage, delegate and supervise other health team members, forming collaborative relationships with a therapeutic goal.

Program Delivery

Practical Nursing—CAS degree is offered in an online distance format. The prerequisite courses can be completed fully online. Once accepted into the core nursing semesters, the clinical and lab courses will be partly online, partly on campus at City College, and partly in the town where the student lives. Students will be required to spend a limited number of days on campus. At this time, the program will be able to coordinate clinical sites within the state of Montana.

Registered Nursing—ASN will include on-site class-room activities/instruction, on-site skills laboratory and clinical practice at hospitals and simulator labs at the City College campus.

Licensure

Degree course work prepares students for licensure. The above mentioned degrees prepares the student for the NCLEX-PN for licensed practical nursing and/or NCLEX-RN for Registered Nursing . To obtain a license in the State of Montana students must graduate from an approved school of nursing, earn passing scores on the NCLEX-PN or NCLEX-RN and have the capacity to maintain the professional code of nursing practice.

Admission to City College

- First-time college students must have a high school diplomas from an accredited high school, a GED or passed the ACT Ability to Benefit exam.
- Transfer students will need to submit records from all regionally accredited institutions.

Admission to Nursing programs

The nursing pathways curriculum is a competitive entrance program based on a selective points system.

Other Nursing Program Recommendations/Requirements:

Certified Nursing Licensure Recommendation

New prospective students looking into either the practical nursing or registered nursing options are recommended to obtain and work as a Certified Nurse Aid (CNA). City College occasionally offers CNA training. Local hospitals, healthcare agencies and nursing homes are other possible locations that offer CNA training.
