Please note that you will need to abide by the approved course content or immediately notify the BACB that the course does not meet the agreed upon requirements.

We will be pleased to link your institution's name on the Approved Course Sequence page of BACB.com to your website. We encourage schools with Approved Course Sequences to post their Approved Course Content Verification Form along with details of the program offered.
