**Immunization Records Are Required.** Any student born after 12/31/56 must show proof of immunization that was administered after 12/31/67. The immunization dates must also be after your first birthday. Requirements include proof of two (2) doses of immunizations against measles (Rubeola) at least 30 days apart and one (1) proof of Rubella immunization. Include month/day/year. Any immunizations administered after June 11, 1993, must be an MMR. The record must be signed by a physician, health agency or school official.

**When you become a Montana State University Billings student following your high school graduation, you will need to submit the \$30 application fee, a final high school transcript, ACT or SAT scores and complete the full Application for Admission.**
