A child with Tourette Syndrome in the classroom may bear the outward appearance of a child with behavior problems: defiant, stubborn, emitting sounds, displaying unusual physical mannerisms, unwilling to cooperate. He may be disciplined for things he cannot control and given low grades for things he cannot accomplish. He is probably teased and sometimes imitated by other students. Come and join us as Dr. James Peak, MD, talks about the rewards and challenges of working with children who have Tourette Syndrome. Particular attention will be placed on strategies for both school and home.
