

Learning Group Overview

Positive Behavior Support (PBS) is an approach to helping people improve their difficult behavior that is based on four things:

1. An understanding that people do not control others, but seek to support others in their own behavior change process
2. A belief that there is a reason behind most difficult behavior, that people with difficult behavior should be treated with compassion and respect, and that they are entitled to lives of quality as well as effective services
3. The application of a large and growing body of knowledge about how to better understand people and make humane changes in their lives that can reduce the occurrence of difficult behavior
4. A conviction to continually move away from coercion, the use of unpleasant events, to manage behavior

In recent years there has been a growing body of research that demonstrates that even the most challenging behaviors can improve with the help of Positive Behavior Support strategies.

This learning group will give participants an opportunity to present a case of a student with challenging needs and develop a Positive Behavioral Support plan specific to that student.

This learning group is appropriate for educators, paraeducators, school psychologists, related service personnel, and parents interested in applying positive behavioral support strategies.

Learning Group Objectives

- Learn the basic philosophy of Positive Behavior Supports
- Learn specific Positive Behavior Support strategies to utilize in a school setting
- Present a case of a student with challenging needs and develop a behavioral plan specific to that student with the input of the learning group members
- Learn how to develop a team approach within the school setting
- Modify existing behavioral plans developed at previous sessions to address student's current needs

Participants are **required** to present a brief case summary (see outline below) for discussion and are encouraged to remain for the duration of the learning group to participate in all of the case presentations. Cases may be presented orally, however short video presentations of 5-10 minutes, are preferred for the group to review. Each case will be allotted a one-hour review. A signed **student information release form from the parent/guardian for case presentation is required**. Sample forms are available on-line at: www.msubillings.edu/cspd/events. Parent participation is strongly encouraged.

Case Presentation Outline

- What is the presenting problem?
- What setting does the problem occur in? Who is the student with?
- What is the nature of the problem? Is it academic, social, or both?
- What specific interventions have been tried to address the problem?
- What are the student's strengths?
- What are the student's needs academically, behaviorally, and developmentally?
