Sandie Rietz called the meeting to order at 3:40 p.m. on December 13, 2001 in room B8 of the College of Technology.

The November 8, 2001 meeting minutes were approved.

# I. ITEMS – FIRST READING

Item 53 (from 00-01) EDUC 584 Student Teaching (K-12). New course. Item 53.a (from 00-01) EDUC 585 Student Teaching (Elementary). New course. Item 53.b (from 00-01) EDUC 586 Student Teaching (Secondary). New course.

Cindy Dell, Director, Certification and Field Experience, explained the above items. They are, in fact, to be six credits, rather than nine, so these classes will correspond with all other student teaching courses. The Special Education courses discussed at earlier Senate meetings have a different endorsement program, and therefore the courses have a different number of credits.

**Item 5** EDCI 536 Instructional Strategies in Music. New course.

**Item 5.a** EDCI 535 Instructional Strategies in Art and Music. Change title and catalog description.

David Davison, Department of Educational Theory and Practice, explained the separation of Item 5.a, and the subsequent creation of Item 5. He stated to give both art and music respectable coverage, they should be two separate courses. The senate discussed the implications of changing EDCI 535.

**Item 5.e** Master of Education Interdisciplinary Studies Option: Teacher Certification Program of Study. Program modifications.

David Davison explained that the changes in Item 5.e clean up errors that were printed in the last Graduate Catalog for this degree program of study. A required course that had been omitted is now added. A one-credit course of student teaching is now added as well. This degree is for students that already have a Bachelor's Degree and are now working toward a Masters <u>and</u> getting certified to teach.

## III. OLD BUSINESS

- **A.** Membership of the ad hoc Committee on Writing Proficiency. Sandie Rietz stated that the Senate has received positive responses from Kathy Holt, Deb Schaffer, Tami Haaland, Tom Rust, and Susan Baack. These names will be sent in a memo to Dr. Janie Park, Provost.
- **B. Performance Based Funding Model Discussion.** Sandie Reitz discussed the results of the ASFAC (Academic Senate/Faculty Association Coalition) meeting on December 6, 2001. Discussion of the Performance Based Funding Model dominated the dialogue. All of the measuring has been remanded back to the departments for design and approval. It was mentioned that a credible reason has not been given as to why Performance Based Funding is necessary. It was also noted that faculty quality is already being assessed with the present system.

## IV. NEW BUSINESS

**A. BoR Report.** Sandie Rietz reported that the credit cap was abolished at the November BoR meeting. The issue of the BoR item to authorize reorganization of the College of Education and Human Services has just now been added to the submission agenda, and will be on the action agenda at the January, 2002 meeting is slated for discussion at the next Senate meeting.

Keith Edgerton will attend the January BoR meeting with Sandie Reitz.
