Carl Castles, Chair, called the meeting to order at 4:03 p.m. in the Chancellor's Conference Room with some members attending via Webex.

It's low enrolled and therefore tough to run. The course has been removed from the program, and they are adding EDU 366, which is a math clinic. The Department already runs a reading clinic and a learning clinic for special education, so the math clinic is modeled after those. The math clinic will be off-campus, unlike the other clinics.

John Roberts, Chair, Music, noted that their accreditors said their applied lessons courses have been overworking the faculty and under charging. So, more applied lessons credits are being added to the program, and as a result, the credits for MUSI 346 & 347 are being reduced. They are also removing the word "option" from the titles of the two BA programs, as their accreditors consider them professional, rather than liberal arts programs. Finally, they are changing the titles of the MUST courses from "Techniques" to "Technology," in keeping with the content presented.

Nicole Bogunovich, Business/Computer Tech, noted that BGEN 280 is not part of the changes in the Accounting programs. It's just a prerequisite clean-up.

Ms. Bogunovich and Heather Thompson-Bahm worked to rewrite the Accounting program based on what they see in the industry today. They have added a capstone course that includes a project, and students choose between that or an internship. The 300-level financial planning course included as one of the restricted electives is no longer offered, so

they are adding the new BFIN 205. This package also supports the creation of a 2+2 with the AS Program of Study and the COB for students to move directly into a CPA bachelor's program. It was noted that we can create new AS (and AA) programs of study without BOR approval. Ms. Bogunovich also noted that the AAS program is meant for students who intend to join the workforce or start their own business.
