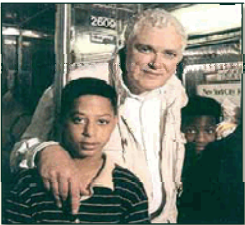


Education Summit: *Preparing Teachers for 21st Century Learners*

John Taylor Gatto is a retired school teacher of 29 years and author of several books on education. He is an activist critical of compulsory schooling and the hegemonic nature of

discourse on education and the education professions. He was named New York City Teacher of the year in 1989, 1990, and 1991, and New York State Teacher of the Year in 1991. In 1991, he began a public speaking and writing career, and has received several awards from libertarian organizations, including the Alexis de Tocqueville Award for Excellence in Advancement of Educational Freedom in 1997.

Mr. Gatto's books include *Dumbing us Down: The Hidden Curriculum of Compulsory Schooling* (1992), *The Exhausted School* (1993), *A Different Kind of Teacher* (2000), and *The Underground History of American Education* (2001).
