
Introduction

The Montana Poll fielded by Montana State University Billings was first conducted in 1989. This year marks the 31st edition of the poll and the 29th year the poll has been conducted. This report summarized the results of a statewide random sample of 471 adult Montanans identified as likely voters. Approximately 82 percent of the survey respondents were contacted via cellphone, while 18 percent were contacted on landline telephone numbers. Randomly generated telephone lists were purchased by the university from Marketing Systems Group based in Horsham, Pa.

The Montana Poll was conducted from October 8-13, 2018, in the Market Research Lab on campus. Students enrolled in PSCI 342: Media, Public Opinion, Polling and additional individuals not affiliated with the university who were employed for the week conducted the interviews. The Montana Poll has a margin of error of plus or minus 4.5 percent (the actual results if the entire population were surveyed would fall within the margin of error 95 percent of the time if multiple surveys using random representatives samples were conducted). Various subgroups have larger margins of error, which are detailed at the conclusion of the report. The geographic distribution of the poll respondents closely resembles the geographic distribution of Montana residents.






Approve of Gov. Steve Bullock


Approve of U.S. Sen. Steve Daines


Initiative 185 (Medicaid expansion/tobacco tax)


Initiative 186 (Ban on new hardrock mines)

Legislative Referendum 128 (Extend higher-ed tax levy)




Legislative Referendum 129 (Ban third-party ballot collection)


Generic Montana State Senate ballot




Approve of Pres. Trump


Approve of Congress


Satisfaction with direction of country


Confidence in law enforcement


Removal from office due to sexual assualt allegations


16. Do you think abortions should be legal under any circumstances, legal only under certain circumstances or illegal in all circumstances?


Roe vs. Wade repealed


Immigration attitudes
