Division of Student Affairs Learning Outcomes

Student Affairs Council has approved the below learning outcomes at the September 28, 2016 Directors' Working Meeting. Developing these outcomes involved a lengthy process including:

- Development of a Student Affairs Assessment Committee comprised of representatives from each department within the Division
- Division-wide and departmental workshops and meetings that were attended by staff from every department in order to provide education and receive feedback regarding division, department, and program learning outcomes
- Comprehensive review of learning outcomes and assessment tools developed by other universities and organizations, as well as AACU Value Rubrics, and CAS Standards
- Consideration given to the integration and relatedness to MSUB's general studies program learning outcomes and the Student Affairs mission

Aligned with the General Studies Outcomes, and the AACU Value Rubrics, the Division of Student Affairs Learning Outcomes are based within three learning domains of the AACU Value Rubrics and are as follows:

INFORMATION LITERACY DOMAIN

Divisional Learning Outcome for INFORMATION LITERACY:

Students who engage with Student Affairs offices, programs, activities, and services will be able to identify, integrate and apply information and skills gained from their experiences that will advance their academic, personal, and career growth.

- d. Students will be able to effectively self-advocate
