 - a. Board of Regents September 2017
 - i. Former Student Trustee is doing research on the merging of the university systems. It is anticipated a preliminary report will be presented at the November Board of Regents meeting
 - ii. Searches are continuing for the President of University of Montana and CEO of Helena College
 - iii. OCHE is hiring a new communications person
 - iv. All 2018 Budgets were approved. No details have been received regarding the Governor's requested reduction. An amended budget will be discussed in November. EBC and UBC meetings will discuss the amended budget.
 - v. BoR will have a work plan for the budget at each meeting.
 - vi. OCHE staff presented on retention statistics for the performance based funding. Request to examine how Pell grant students are receiving support for retention. What additional factors are there to support these students?

Draft recommendations 1) Campus Coordinator for Native American Student Services 2) Departmental Primary Point of Contact 3) Collect and share data across campus and within the MUS system 4) Provide a common professional development for all faculty and staff 5) Every effort should be made to include American Indian cultural, historical and social challenges in interviews, contracts and performance evaluations of all faculty and staff. Darla reported statistics for those MSUB students who registered within the Everfi system;

EverFi Data (Alcohol Edu, Haven, Transit)

73% have completed Part One in Alcohol Edu

75% have completed Part One in Haven

85% have completed Part One in Transit

Of all students who must complete the courses, 65% have registered (this includes the total number of student who have OR have not registered within EverFi)

Fall 2016 MSUB data shows that of the students who completed Part Two of Alcohol Edu:

82% said the course prepared them to make responsible decisions about drinking

80% said it prepared them to prevent an alcohol overdose

85% said it prepared them to help someone who may have alcohol poisoning

57% said it changed their perceptions of other's drinking behavior

4. University Mental Health Task Force (Darla)

The MSU report to the BoR was compiled into one report. The following MSUB recommendations were;

- a. Continuing to look for resources to add FTE counseling
- b. Jeff is a Certified Instructor for Question, Persuade, and Refer (QPR) Gatekeeper Training for suicide prevention. MSUB now has 4 certified instructors
- c. MSUB has increased awareness of the Student Consultation Team
- d. Armory is established at University Police
- e. Postvention Committee to look at suicide.
- f. Increase awareness of existing resources on campus and in the community.
