GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Jake Beitinger, Central Washington (F, 6-8, Jr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap) and Luke Cooper, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-0, Sr., Melbourne, Australia). Beitinger, a transfer from Eastern Washington, scored 39 points and pulled down 21 rebounds as the Wildcats swept a pair of home games. Beitinger had 17 rebounds against Saint Martin's, the most for a CWU player since 2001. He also blocked three shots against the Saints. Cooper tied his own GNAC single-game record with 16 assists increasing his GNAC career-record total to 704 as the Seawolves extended their win streak to 10 with a 20-point win against Alaska Fairbanks. Cooper, who had just one turnover in playing all 40 minutes, also had three rebounds and made his only field goal attempt on the evening.

HONORABLE MENTION: Ira Graham, Western Washington (G, 6-1, Jr., Fontana, CA) scored 56 points, including 33 in a four-point win over Western Oregon to equal the GNAC 2007-08 single-game best scoring mark. It was his 18th consecutive double-digit scoring game. Graham made 18 of 33 shots as WWU split two games. Travis Kuhns, Western Oregon (F, 6-8, Jr., Salem, OR - Sprague) scored 51 points, including 32 in a four-point road loss at Western Washington. Kuhns made 17 of 24 shots, including six of eight three-pointers. He was 11 of 12 from the foul line.

AROUND THE GNAC: Cooper's 16 assists tied the GNAC single-game record first set by UAA's Bryson Vaughan against Western Oregon in 2002 and equaled by Cooper against Missouri-Kansas City in the 2006 Great Alaska Shootout. . Saint Martin's Jake Linton made 12 of 13 free throws, extending his consecutive streak of made free throws to 34 before missing. That equaled the third longest streak in conference history. Earlier this season he made 28 in a row in setting a GNAC record with 44 consecutive free throws (including his final 16 attempts last season).

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: McCade Olsen had a double-double with 26 points and 10 rebounds as the Seawolves improved to 12-0 against Division II opponents. UAA, which led by only three at halftime, shot 58.8 percent (30-51) including 65.4 percent (17-26) in the final 20 minutes.

Alaska Fairbanks: Colin Matteson and Mike Titus combined for 33 points and six three-pointers in 10 attempts in a 77-57 loss at Anchorage. Matteson had 19 points (3 of 6 on treys) and Titus had 14 (3 of 4 on three-pointers).

Central Washington: Six players averaged in double figures as the Wildcats tallied 181 points in two double-digit victories. In addition to Beitinger's 39, CWU also got 28 points from Nate Jackson, 27 from Matt Penoncello, 24 from Giovonne Woods and 21 from Brandon Foote.

Montana State Billings: Troy Huff scored 27 points and Aaron Terry had 24 in home losses to Northwest Nazarene and Seattle Pacific. Ruff had 15, connecting on five of nine three-pointers, in MSUB's six-point loss to Seattle Pacific.

Northwest Nazarene: Joel Ryman led Northwest Nazarene with 28 points as the Crusaders split two games. Ryman made six of 12 three-pointers to account for more than half of NNU's team total of 11 (in 38 attempts).

Saint Martin's: Jake Linton scored 37 points as the Saints split two games, earning their first win against Western Washington at Bellingham since Dec. 3, 1998. Bill Richardson had 30 points and Tyler Nixon had 20 rebounds in the two contests.

Seattle: Nine players scored between 12 and 19 points as the Redhawks split two games. Michael Wright led the way with 19 points and was also one of five players with 12 or more rebounds. Wright had 12, five at the offensive end. Leigh Swanson had a team-high 17 boards.

Seattle Pacific: Rob Will led a balanced attack with 25 points in wins over Seattle and MSU Billings. JoJay Jackson contributed 24 points and Rob Diederichs had 23. Both Will and Jackson made nine of 17 shots. Jackson, Diederichs and Jared Moultrie all had 10 rebounds.

Western Oregon: Western Oregon shot at a .500 clip and outrebounded its two opponents 72-55 in losses at Ellensburg and Bellingham. The Wolves, however, had a 41-24 turnover deficit and were outshot .536 to .500, surrendering 18 three-pointers in 31 attempts.

Western Washington: Calin Schell scored 27 points and also led the Vikings with 20 rebounds as they split two home games. WWU blocked 14 shots in the two contests, four each by Steve Alford and Steve Severin.
