GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Alyssa Given, Seattle Pacific (OH, 5-10, Sr., Salinas, CA) had 43 kills, 13 digs and six blocks in a pair of matches and finished her career as the No. 2 kill and point producer in GNAC history. She ended up second in points (1,718) to Louise Free of Northwest Nazarene (1,723 between 1999 and

2002) and second in kills (1,454) to Seattle University's Sarah Sommerman (1,461 between 2002 and 2005). Given also ended up first in kill attempts (4,041) and aces (188) and third in kills per game (3.96).

HONORABLE MENTION: Courtney Schneider, Western Washington (L, 5-9, Sr., Snohomish, WA) had 50 digs, increasing her season total to a school and GNAC record 678, breaking her own record of 666 that she set last season. Schneider now has 2,522 career digs. She has a career average of 6.95 and is on pace to crush the current national record of 6.06. . .Cammy Dranginis, Northwest Nazarene (MB, 6-0, So., Nampa, ID - Skyview) had 23 kills and 17 blocks, including 11 in a 3-0 sweep of Seattle. The 11 blocks is a GNAC record for three-game matches, breaking the old mark of 10 set by Starr Burgan of Alaska Anchorage in 2001 and equaled twice by Alicia Denny of Saint Martin's in 2002.

NCAA PACIFIC REGIONALS: Western Washington will take a 16-match win streak into the regional tournament. It is the fifth regional (2001-03, 2006) for the Vikings, who have a 1-4 tournament record (1-1 vs. Cal State L.A, 0-1 vs. Cal State San Bernardino and 0-2 vs. UC San Diego). ... It is the first NCAA playoff appearance for both Northwest Nazarene and Western Oregon. . WWU is 4-2 this fall against regional qualifiers, splitting with Western Oregon and sweeping NNU. The Vikings won their only encounter with Cal Poly Pomona, but lost to Cal State San Bernardino. . .Western Oregon is 2-5, splitting with WWU and NNU and losing to Chico State, Cal Poly Pomona and CSU San Bernardino. . .NNU is 2-4, splitting with WOU, losing twice to Western Washington and dividing two matches with CCAA schools, defeating Chico State and losing to UC San Diego.

AROUND THE GNAC: Emily Castro and Tiana Roma each had 22 kills as Western Washington wrapped up the GNAC title with 3-0 home wins against Western Oregon and Saint Martin's. The Vikings have 12 sweeps and have lost just four games during their 16-match win streak. . . Allison James had 13 kills, nine blocks and 66 assists in Northwest Nazarene's two wins. .Kady Try had 29 kills and 24 digs and Rachael Schurman had 27 kills and eight blocks as Central Washington won twice, finishing its season with five victories in its final six matches. . .Alicia Cazemier had 34 kills and Devon Crotteau had 33 as Montana State Billings' split two matches. Cazemier also had 13 blocks. . .Seattle Pacific's Rachel Biornstad had 15 blocks as SPU outblocked its opponents 26-19 in splitting two matches. . .Kayla Mainer led Western Oregon with 33 kills and five aces and also had 30 digs in losses at Bellingham and Ellensburg. . .Nikole Thompson led Seattle with 30 kills and 34 digs and finished her career ninth on the GNAC all-time kill list with 1,211 and 13th in points (1,364). She also had 869 career digs. . .Shealun Campisi had 28 kills and 27 digs for Saint Martin's in losses to CWU and WWU. . . Megan Thigpen had 17 kills as Alaska Fairbanks snapped an nine-match losing streak defeating

Alaska Anchorage. Joanna Johnson led UAA with 27 kills and 19 digs.
