GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Alyssa Given, Seattle Pacific (OH, 5-10, Sr., Salinas, CA - Notre Dame) and Jaime Anderson, Western Washington (OH, 6-0, Sr., SeaTac, WA -Mount Rainier). . . Given had 39 kills, including 28 in a 3-1 win Saturday at Anchorage. Her 28 kills equaled the fourth highest four-game match total in GNAC history. Her .558 attack percentage (28-4-43) against the Seawolves ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in GNAC history for four-game matches. The 28 kills is also the second highest total this fall for any match. Overall, she hit .367 for the weekend (39-10-79) and also had 21 digs and six aces, moving into first-place on the GNAC all-time career list in aces with 186. She also moved into a tie for third-place in GNAC history in career kills with Meghan Evoy of Western Washington(2001-04) with 1,379 and is 82 short of the all-time mark. . . Anderson had 34 kills and hit for a .372 percentage as the Vikings extended their win streak to 12 with a pair of 3-0 sweeps, their ninth and 10<sup>th</sup> during the streak. Anderson also had 21 digs, three blocks and three aces.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** Erin Norris, Central Washington (OP, 5-10, So., Spokane, WA - Mead) had 23 kills, eight aces and six blocks as the Wildcats kept alive their hopes for a winning season with a pair of 3-0 wins. Norris hit .400 (23-7-40) in the two matches. Her eight aces gave her a school-record 61 on the season.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** Western Washington posted a .356 hitting percentage in its victories. In addition to Anderson's 34 kills, Emily Castro had 21. Tiana Roma had 18 kills and a teambest nine blocks, while Courtney Schneider added 52 more digs to her GNAC-record career total, which now stands at 2,401. . .Cammy Dranginis (29), Loni Evenson (27) and Lindsay Forseth (24) combined for 80 kills as Northwest Nazarene extended its win streak to six. Dranginis also led the Crusaders with 13 blocks and Forseth had a team-best 41 digs. . .Seattle Pacific more than doubled its opponents hitting percentage (.287 to .135), had 20 more aces (27-7) including nine by Joelle Perez and eight by Angie Wodrich and twice as many blocks (16-8) in wins over Alaska Fairbanks and Alaska Anchorage. . . Rachael Schurman had 22 kills, 11 aces and seven blocks in Central Washington's two wins. The Wildcats had a 30-3 ace advantage as they outscored MSU Billings and Seattle 43-22 from the service line. . .Kayla Mainer led four players in double figures with 22 kills in Western Oregon's win at Saint Martin's. Shealun Campisi led the Saints with 13 kills. . . Alaska Anchorage's Joanna Johnson had 35 kills and 42 digs, including 37 in a 3-1 loss to Northwest Nazarene. . . Megan Thigpen led Alaska Fairbanks with 22 kills and 24 digs and Erica Gage had 11 blocks. . . Nikole Thompson had 27 kills, twice as many as any of her teammates, in Seattle University's two matches at Bellingham and Ellensburg. . . MSU Billings' Jennifer Boe and Devon Crotteau each had 20 kills in losses to CWU and WWU.

**GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK:** Meredith Teague, Seattle Pacific (M, 5-4, Jr., Redmond, WA – Bellevue Christian) scored one goal and had two assists as she was involved in all the non-penalty kick goals in 2-0 wins over

Seattle University and Montana State Billings as the Falcons clinched their fifth GNAC title in the past six years. The two assists were her 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of the year, a total surpassed by just one player in GNAC history, Seattle's Ashley Porter who has had 14 each of the past three years.

AROUND THE GNAC: Hilary Hughes scored Northwest Nazarene's lone goal in a 2-1 loss at Seattle University. The Crusaders were outshot 29-1 in the contest, but the Redhawks still had to score twice in the final 14 minutes to pull out the victory. Leah Wymer scored the first goal, her league-leading 17th of the season as Ashley Porter earned her 14th assist, equaling her own GNAC single-season record she first set in 2005 and tied last year. Jasmine then got the game-winner two minutes later. . .Jesslyn Rahm had four saves in Seattle Pacific's two shutout wins, her eighth and ninth shutouts of the season. Kara Hamby and Claire Grubbs had the game-winner goals. . .Danielle Ritter had two goals in Montana State Billings' 4-0 shutout of Northwest Nazarene. Ali Gamberg earned two assists. . . Teresa Fish had two saves in registering her school record 10th shutout of the season in Western Washington's 1-0 defeat of Saint Martin's. The shutout increased Fish's career total to a school and GNAC-record 31. Lucy Miller scored on a header for the lone goal, her sixth goal and third-game winner of the season. . . Amber Easterbrook and Kelsie Blachly each had six saves as Central Washington and Western Oregon battled to a 1-1 tie. The tie was CWU's fourth of the year equaling the GNAC record set by Seattle Pacific in 2005 and equaled last year by the Wildcats.

WON-LOSS RECORDS: Seattle Pacific extended its consecutive win record to 19. The GNAC record for most consecutives games without a loss is 24 by the Falcons in 2005. . GNAC teams finished 27-16-5 against outside competition, including 22-13-1 against Division II schools. GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK: Sam Charles, Montana State Billings (F, So., Chiswell, England) became just the second player in GNAC history to produce 40 points in a single season as he had a goal and an assist in a 2-0 home win over Seattle Pacific. Charles'41-point total (19 goals, 3 assists) trails only Bobby McAllister's 49-point production (22 goals, 5 assists) in 2004 when he led Seattle University to the NCAA Division II national title. The 2-0 win also clinched the Yellowjackets second-place in the GNAC and put them into a strong position to earn a NCAA playoff berth.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** Chase Franklin, Saint Martin's (F, 5-8, Fr., Covington, WA - Kentlake) scored all three of the Saint goals in a 2-1 win over Northwest and a 5-1 loss to Western Washington. Franklin has scored five of SMU's 11 goals, including its last four.
