VI. ADVISOR REPORTS – Chancellor Edelman

- -Residence halls costs have been reduced, beginning Fall 2019, as well as more flexibility in meal plans.
- -Vicki Trier has been hired as the new dean of city college.
- -Operations and programs on the college are being restructured. For example, removing 2-year programs that do not lead to a job upon completion.
- -There are promising candidates for the Vice Chancellor position.
- -Possible out-of-state tuition fare changes and wavers in the future; MSUB needs more out-of-state recruitment due to the drop in MT graduation numbers
- -Attended the NCAA convention last week and appeared in Seattle the week before; MSUB has been approved for accreditation.
- -Chris Kukulski, City Administrator of Billings is interested in helping promote MSUB publicity, bus routes, etc.
- -Fall enrollment had fallen about 4.2%, but spring enrollment is improved from that (up 300 applicants).

- -A new bus route (Bus Route #24) has been established to city college. It is faster than the city bus and runs every hour.
- -There is a need for a forum to present fees. Meeting must be on Monday 2/4/19. President Keltner is working with Kathy Kotecki on this.
