GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: McCade Olsen, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-8, Sr., Riverton, UT – Eastern Wyoming) was selected the Most Outstanding Player in the NCAA West Regional. In three games, Olsen scored 68 points and also had 14 rebounds, six assists, two blocks and five steals. He made 24 of 41 field goal attempts, four of seven three-pointers and all 16 of his free throw attempts.

WEST REGION HIGHLIGHTS: Joining Olsen on the all-tournament team were teammates Carl Arts and Luke Cooper. Arts scored 54 points (22-42 FG, 2-5 3-pointers, 8-12 FTs) and

GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Kalhie Quinones, Alaska Anchorage (G, 5-7, Sr., Loveland, CO – Utah State) scored 50 points, including a game-high 14 in the championship game, to earn Most Outstanding Player honors in leading the Seawolves to the West Region title Quinones made 21 of 33 shots (63.6 percent) and also had 14 rebounds, eight assists and a team-best eight steals.

WEST REGION HIGHLIGHTS: UAA's Rebecca Kielpinski and Daesha Henderson and Beth Christensen of Seattle Pacific joined Quinones on the all-tournament team. . . Kielpinski had 29 points and team-highs in rebounds (29), assists (12) and blocks (8). She made 10 of 21 shots and nine of 12 free throws. . .Henderson scored 33 points, including a career-high 23 in Seattle Pacific's come-from-behind win Saturday against UC San Diego. Henderson also had nine rebounds and a team-high six steals. Christensen scored 17 points and was credited with 22 assists and five steals. She finished her career with 501 assists, breaking the old GNAC career record of 500 previously held by Melanie Wagoner of Alaska Fairbanks (1999-02). . .UAA's Ruby Williams also had an outstanding tournament, finishing with 36 points and 23 rebounds. Maria Nilsson had 23 points, 16 assists, nine assists and four steals. Nilsson made two huge plays in the closing moments of Monday's win over Seattle Pacific, knocking down a three-pointer with 1:10 left to give UAA a four-point lead and then coming up with a steal with seven seconds left to seal the win. Nilsson was seven of 14 on treys in the tournament. ..Jackie Hollands led Seattle Pacific in the tournament with 37 points. Kelsey Hill had 33 points and team-highs of 17 rebounds and four blocks.

THIS WEEK: Wednesday-Thursday – Big Green In the Desert at Scottsdale, AZ (SPU). Saturday – ASU Baldy Castillo Invitational (SPU); Club NW Spring Break Open at Edmonds (CWU, SPU, SU, WWU); Oregon Preview (CWU, WOU); UPS Spring Break (SU).

ATHLETES-OF-THE-WEEK: Male - Michael Madrid, Alaska Anchorage (Sr., Anchorage, AK - East) tied school records in the 100 (10.89) and 200 (22.14) and also ran the anchor as the Seawolves ran the fastest 4x100 time (42.01) in the GNAC in five years at the Northridge Relays. His time in the 100 equals the fourth fastest in GNAC history and his 200 time ranks ninth on the GNAC Top 10 chart. Female - Jessica Harper, Western Oregon (Jr., Oregon City, OR - Clackamas) and Jessica Pixler, Seattle Pacific (So., Sammamish, WA -Eastlake). . . Harper ran an automatic national qualifying time in finishing second in the steeplechase in a three-way meet involving the Wolves, Southern Oregon and Willamette at Salem. Her time of 10:51.52 is the second best in GNAC history and eclipsed her previous provisional national qualifying time by 30 seconds. . .Pixler successfully defended her national mile title and finished third in the 800 to account for 18 of Seattle Pacific's 33 points as the Falcons finished ninth in the NCAA Division II national indoor meet at Mankato, Minn. Pixler, who has now won four national titles (two in the indoor mile, one in the outdoor 1500 and one in cross country), was clocked in 4:47.79 in the mile and 2:12.60 in the 800.

HONORABLE MENTION: Elizabeth Chepkosgei, Alaska Anchorage (So., Kapsabet, Kenya) posted an automatic national qualifying time in the women's 5,000 at the Oxy Distance Carnival in Los Angeles. Chepkosgei's time of 17:10.17 is the third best in GNAC history. She also posted a provisional and school-record mark of 10:19.18 in the 3,000 meters at Northridge and was UAA's only winner in the latter meet. . Jane Larson, Seattle Pacific (So., Fall City, WA – Cedar Park Christian) matched Pixler's two All-American awards at the NCAA Division II National Indoors, finishing second to her teammate in the mile in a time of 4:51.74 and also running the lead leg on SPU's third-place distance medley relay team, which was timed in 11:45.88.

NATIONAL, REGIONAL HONORS: Pixler was selected as the NCAA Division II National Track Athlete-of-the-Year and John Riak of Saint Martin's, Zeb Udell of Western Oregon and Pixler were selected as the top indoor athletes in the NCAA West Region by the United State Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. The awards were announced prior to the national meet. Riak was selected as the West Region Male Indoor Track Athlete-of-the-Year, while Udell won the award for the field athletes. Pixler was honored as the top Female track athlete in the region. Mike Johnson of Western Oregon and Karl Lerum of Seattle Pacific were selected as the USTFCCCA West Region Male Team and Female Team Coaches-of-the-Year.

AROUND THE GNAC: Seattle Pacific earned eight All-American awards at the NCAA Indoor nationals. In addition to two each by Pixler and Larson, Teona Golding earned an All-American certificate by placing fifth in the high jump and

Mellisa Peaslee, Lisa Anderberg and Karin Rohde earned All-American awards in the distance medley. Ashley Puga of Northwest Nazarene was the only other GNAC All-American. She placed eighth in the mile in a time of 4:58.09. . . In addition to Chepkosgei's automatic time, Alaska Anchorage got provisional qualifying times at Occidental from Laura Carr in the women's 5,000 and David Kiplagat in the men's 3,000 steeplechase. Carr's time of 17:19.33 is the fifth best in GNAC history and Kiplagat's time ranks ninth. Auston Ellis ran the 10,000 in a GNAC season-best time of 32:40.54. . . In addition to Madrid and Chepkosgei's school records at Northridge, UAA's Shaun Ward set a new school record in the 110 high hurdles (16.04). David Kiplagat and Jessica Houston had GNAC season-best marks in the 1500 (3:56.56) and women's shot put (42-6 3/4), respectively. Houston improved her previous GNAC leading mark

MORE GNAC T&F HIGHLIGHTS: Western Oregon's Lyndsey McKillip finished third behind teammate Jessica Harper in the steeplechase at Salem in a provisional national qualifying time of 11:19.42. In addition to Harper, three other Western Oregon athletes had GNAC season-best marks – Lloyd Massey in both the 110 (15.27) and 400 hurdles (55.26), Jeff Long in the 800 (1:55.08) and Tyler Reisnaur in the triple jump (44-4 ³/4). . .Scott McCoy of Central Washington won the pole vault in the Dusty Lane Open in Spokane with a GNAC-leading mark of 15-3. McCoy and Kevin Blount in the steeplechase (10:19.17) were CWU's lone winners in the meet. . .Northwest Nazarene athletes won six events in the NNU Open Saturday at Nampa. In separate competitions, the Crusaders' Josh Grewe won the decathlon with 5,796 points and NNU athletes won 10 events in a mini-meet Friday at NNU.
