PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Player – Jamie Nilsen, Central Washington (SS, 6-0, Sr., Federal Way, WA - Jefferson) reached base 77.8 percent of the time (14 of 18) and scored a third of his team's runs (7 of 21) as the Wildcats beat Northwest Nazarene three times, twice winning in their final at bat. Nilsen, who is batting .509 in conference games, had eight hits in 12 at bats, walked three times and was hit by pitches three times. He also had two doubles to tie the GNAC career record for most doubles of 53 set by Adam Siler of Saint Martin's between 2004 and 2007. He has been hit by pitches 52 times in his career, 23 more than anyone else in GNAC history. Pitcher - Mike Eisenhauer, Western Oregon (6-0, Jr., West Linn, OR - College of the Desert) didn't allow an earned run in eight innings in a 15-1 win at Montana State Billings as he won his fifth straight game after an 0-3 start. In two contests, he allowed two earned runs in 10 innings, walking just one and striking out eight.

HONORABLE MENTION: Michael McCanna, Central Washington (P, 6-5, So., Addy, WA - Jenkins) allowed just four hits in six innings pitching the Wildcats to a 6-4 win over Northwest Nazarene in Saturday's opener. McCanna is unbeaten in five decisions and in conference games is the GNAC leader in wins (4) and ERA (3.04). Dylan Bruck, Western Oregon (OF, 6-0, Sr., Wilsonville, OR – Chemeketa) had 10 hits in 22 at bats (.455), scored six runs and drove in seven. In four games at Billings, he batted .474 (9 of 19). Among his hits were three doubles and a home run.

CWU, WOU IN A SHOWDOWN IN MONMOUTH: Central Washington will take a half game lead over six-time GNAC champion Western Oregon into this weekend's four-game series at Monmouth. . The series will feature the conferences' top six pitchers in ERA – CWU's Michael McCanna (2.38), Tyler Levin (2.70) and Derek Shoemaker (2.93) rank 1-2-3 and Western Oregon's Mike Cusick (3.31), Mike Eisenhauer (3.39) and Mike Ward (4.23) rank 4-5-6 – and the league's top two hitters – Nilsen (.447) and WOU's Dylan Bruck (.420). . Western Oregon has won 10 straight and 13 of 14 since losing three of four games to the Wildcats in Ellensburg. Central has won seven of eight and 18 of 22 since opening the season with seven consecutive losses. . .Including this weekend's series, Central plays 15 of its last 17 conference contests on the road, while the Wolves play 12 of their final 16 at home.

AROUND THE GNAC: Though he made only four outs in four games, Nilsen's 16-game hitting streak – which equals the 10th longest in GNAC history – came to an end in Friday's second game when he was officially 0 for 1. He did reach base three times in the contest, walking once and being hit twice. . . CWU was also led offensively by Nate Rylaarsdam who had six hits in 13 at bats, including the game-winning hit in the bottom of the ninth in Friday's 5-4 win and Frank Donangelo who had five hits in 12 at bats and a team-high six RBI. . . Bruck extended his hitting streak to 20 games, the third longest in GNAC history, before drawing the collar in Saturday's second game at Billings. WOU shortstop Cesar Lopez had six hits in 14 at bats and drove in a team-best nine runs. . .Ryan Bailey led Northwest Nazarene with six hits and four runs in its series against CWU. Jimmy VanBeek drove in a team-best four runs. .Jonathan Schlender batted .429 (9 of 21) as MSUB won one of six contests. The Yellowjackets hit .298 during the week, but its pitching staff gave up 62 runs and allowed its opponents to hit for a .372 average.

PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Player – Liz Wallace, Central Washington (SS, 5-6, Jr., Florence, MT – Florence-Carlton) went six for six and drove in five runs to lead the Wildcats to a doubleheader sweep of Northwest Nazarene. Among her hits in the opener was a fifth-inning single that snapped a 2-2 tie. Pitcher – Katriina Reime, Central Washington (6-0, So., Hoquiam, WA) and Kelsey Reynolds, Seattle University (5-9, So., Kent, WA – Kentlake). . .Reime allowed just four hits and one run in three relief appearances, including two against regionally top-ranked Humboldt State. In 7 1/3 innings, she didn't walk a batter, fanned six and picked up a victory. Reynolds allowed six hits in a 3-1 win over defending GNAC champion Western Washington as the Redhawks swept the Vikings to move into a tie for first-place with CWU.

HONORABLE MENTION: Jessica Frank, Montana State Billings (SS, 5-4, Sr., Great Falls, MT – C.M. Russell) had seven hits, including two doubles and three home runs in 13 at bats to lead the Yellowjackets to three wins in a pair of nonconference doubleheaders. Frank scored eight runs and drove in seven and also stole four bases. Jamie Foote, Seattle University (3B, 5-4, Jr., Lynnwood, WA – Mountlake Terrace) had three hits, including a pair of doubles to lead the Redhawks to a doubleheader sweep of Western Washington. One of her doubles snapped a 1-1 tie in SU's 3-1 second-game victory.

AROUND THE GNAC: Frank set a GNAC record with 12 total bases in MSUB's 9-0 win Sunday at Great Falls. She had four hits including two home runs and two doubles. The old record was 10. MSUB has won nine of its last 10 games with the lone loss coming in a game in which it had a 6-0 lead. . Katie Gould had four hits in five at bats in Seattle University's sweep of Western Washington. She also scored two runs and drove in one. SU outhit the Vikings .340 to .216 in the twinbill. . .Jael Henthorn had four hits as Northwest Nazarene won one of four games, splitting with College of Idaho before losing twice

at Ellensburg. . .Holly Rossman had six hits in 13 at bats as CWU split four games, losing twice to Humboldt State before sweeping NNU. . .Kelsey Anderson had two of Western Washington's three RBI in their twinbill loss at Seattle University. The Vikings have now lost six straight.

ATHLETES-OF-THE-WEEK: Male – Jordan Welling, Western Washington (Fr., Burlington, WA – Burlington-Edison) ran the third fastest 5,000 meter time in GNAC history at Stanford, placing sixth in his heat in a time of 14:34.08. Female – Laura Carr, Alaska Anchorage (Jr., South Bend, Ind.) and Jane Larson, Seattle Pacific (So., Fall City, WA – Cedar Park Christian). . .Both Carr and Larson established automatic qualifying times for the NCAA national meet at Stanford. Carr set a GNAC record in the 5,000, bettering the automatic national standard by almost 15 seconds with a time of 16:56.48, and eclipsing the old conference record of 16:59.08 set by Ashley Vincent of Western Washington in 2003. She is just the third GNAC athlete to run below 17 minutes. . .Larson finished 1.34 seconds below the automatic standard in the 1,500 with a time of 4:28.66. Her time was the third fastest in GNAC history.

WILLAMETTE INVITATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS: Alaska Anchorage won six events and also set or tied four GNAC season-best marks. Michael Madrid won the 100 meters, tying his own GNAC season-best mark of 10.89. He also finished second in the 200 in a time of 21.92, cutting .22 seconds off his GNAC leading mark. Madrid also led UAA to a win in the 4x400 relay in a GNAC season-best time of 3:22.99 as the Seawolves chopped .35 seconds off their previous best. UAA's Mick Boyle won two different 800 races, running a GNAC season-best 1:54.14 on Friday. . . Western Oregon got two wins as Jacque Postlewait won the women's 100 hurdles in a GNAC season-best time of 14.63 and Sabrina Freed won the hammer with a throw of 168-5. Freed added 16 inches to her previous GNAC season-best and provisional national qualifying mark. . . .Melissa Peaslee of Seattle Pacific won the women's pole vault (11-5 3/4) and Central Washington's Marcie Mullen won the women's 10,000 in a GNAC season-best and PNQ time of 36:41.83. Mullen's time was the third fastest in GNAC history

... John Riak of Saint Martin's took the conference lead in the men's 10,000, placing second in a time of 31:12.77. In Friday's women's 800, Lisa Anderberg of Seattle Pacific finished second in a time of 2:14.79, cutting .17 seconds off her previous PNQ and GNAC season-best time. . .Two other athletes established new PNQs and two improved on previous PNQs. In the men's 5,000, Bennett Grimes of Western Washington placed sixth in a time of 14:42.57, bettering the provisional standard by 2 1/2 seconds. His mark ranks sixth all-time in the GNAC. In the women's steeplechase, Suzie Strickler of Seattle Pacific cut 15 seconds off her previous PNQ in finishing second in a time of 11:08.40, the fourth quickest time in GNAC history. Lyndsey McKillip of Western Oregon placed third in a time of 11:17.93, 1 1/2 seconds better than her previous PNQ. Sara Benson of Central Washington placed fifth in a new PNQ of 11:22.51.

STANFORD INVITATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS: In addition to Carr, Larson and Welling, there were several other outstanding performances by GNAC athletes at Stanford. . .UAA's Elizabeth Chepkosgei improved her previous provisional national qualifying time in the 1500 by .77 seconds posting a time of 4:39.44. . . Matt Valdez of Central Washington established a GNAC season-best mark in the shot with a put of 49-8 1/2. . . Western Washington freshman Sarah Porter had a first-time NCAA Division II national provisional qualifying in the women's 5,000 in 17:38.86, Porter's time ranks eighth on the GNAC all-time list (No. 3 this season). Tyler Fischer of Central Washington had a GNAC season-best mark placing fifth in his section of the discus with a throw of 157-8. He added 10 feet to his previous season best mark. . . Monika Gruszecki of Western Washington had the best finish of any GNAC athlete in the meet, placing fifth in the women's javelin (144-0). Gruszecki improved her previous provisional national mark by over two feet.

UPS SHOTWELL HIGHLIGHTS: Western Washington outscored host Puget Sound 198 1/2 to 118 to win the men's division and Central Washington 170 1/2 to 115 to win the women's team title. . The Vikings established three GNAC season-bests in the meet. Sarah Brownell won the women's 400 in a conference-leading time of 58.55. Heidi Dimmitt won the 400 hurdles in a time of 1:03.18, improving her previous GNAC season-leading mark by .84 seconds. Keefe Brockman won the men's high jump in a GNAC-best mark of 6-5. . The only other GNAC-best mark was by Andrew Steiger of Central Washington who won the men's javelin with a provisional national qualifying mark of 197-6.

IDAHO COLLEGIATE: Northwest Nazarene's Latoya Tidwell finished third in the women's 200 meters (25.71) and Greg Hamm won the triple jump with a leap of 44-6 ¼ in GNAC season-best performances. The Crusaders won a total of six events in the two-day meet. On Friday, Ashley Puga won the women's 1500 and Amy Carroll won the hammer. On Saturday, Dallas Beaty swept the 110 (15.80) and 400 hurdles (56.16) and Grant Miller won the discus (142-3).
