**PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Player** – Dylan Bruck, Western Oregon (OF, 6-0, Sr., Wilsonville, WA - Chemeketa) batted .462 (6 of 13) and had team-highs of five runs scored and four RBI as the Wolves won three of four games with Central Washington to move 1 ½ games ahead of the Wildcats in the GNAC pennant race. Bruck figured prominently in two of WOU's three victories. In Saturday's 6-5 win, he led off the first inning with a single, then stole second and third before scoring on a ground out. An inning later, he staked WOU to a 5-0 lead with a grand slam home run. In Sunday's 6-5 win, his bunt single in the fifth led to two runs on a throwing error and then he scored on a single by Travis Fox as WOU overcame a 4-1 deficit. **Pitcher** – Alex VanOeveren, Northwest Nazarene (6-2, Sr., Fall City, WA – Mt. Si) had the best pitching performance in a series that produced 77 runs in four games. He allowed just six hits and one run and fanned eight in seven innings in Friday's 10-7 Crusader victory to improve to 5-2 on the season.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** A.J. Gosney, Central Washington (OF, 5-9, Jr., Spokane, WA – Central Valley & CCS), who came into the series with Western Oregon hitting just .250, had nine hits, including a double and triple, in 13 at bats. He scored two runs and drove in three.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** Western Oregon won three of four games with Central Washington despite being outlitt .307 to .236 and being outscored 20-19. The Wolves won three games by a run to improve to 6-3 in one-run games. Reliever Ben Shivers pitched in three of the four games, earning a win and a save. .CWU shortstop Jamie Nilsen had seven hits in 14 at bats and scored a series high six runs. Jake Millbauer retired all 10 hitters he faced to earn a save in CWU's 8-4 victory on Sunday. .CWU and WOU ended up dividing their eight-game season series with each team winning three of four on their home field. .Ryne Phillips had seven hits in 13 at bats and Zach Aakhus went eight for 15 and scored seven runs as Northwest Nazarene won three of four games with Saint Martin's. NNU shortstop Severo Rodriguez had three home runs and eight RBI and Aakhus, who leads the GNAC in home runs (11) and RBI (42) had a pair of four-baggers. .Tom Barlow had seven hits in 15 at bats to pace Saint Martin's. Brandon Kuykendall was six of 18, hit two home runs and drove in seven runs. .Jonathan Schlender had eight hits – all singles – in 20 at bats in extending his hitting streak to 10 games as Montana State Billings won one of five non-conference contests. Matt Kakalecik had six hits in 17 at bats, including four doubles.

**PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK:** **Player** – Jessica Frank, Montana State Billings (SS, 5-4, Sr., Great Falls, MT) had a huge week, leading the Yellowjackets to five conference wins in six road games. Frank had 13 hits, including a “double cycle”, in 24 at bats. Among her hit with seven singles, two doubles, two triples and two home runs. She also drove in nine runs and stole three bases. **Pitcher** – Katie Fleer, Western Oregon (6-2, Sr., Salem, OR – Chemeketa) and Lisa Moore, Montana State Billings (5-6, Jr., Bakersfield, CA – Liberty). Fleer posted a 3-0 record in four appearances, allowing just one run and recording a 0.40 ERA in 17 2/3 innings. She walked five and fanned 12. Moore won all four of her decisions, allowing 17 hits and fanning 21 in 21 2/3 innings. She doubled her season win total improving to 8-5.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** Jane Purdy, Seattle University (2B, 5-5, Sr., Missoula, MT – Sentinel) had 11 hits in 18 at bats, including two doubles and her first home run of the season. She also drove in five runs. . .Tyler Sutherland, Western Oregon (SS, 5-3, So., Gold Hill, OR – Crater) figured in half of WOU's runs as the Wolves won four of five road games. Sutherland had nine hits in 20 at bats, including two home runs, scored four runs and drove in three. Her two-run homer was the difference in a 2-1 win Friday at Bellingham and she scored the game's only run in a 1-0 non-conference win Sunday at Seattle University.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** Leslie Davis and Kelly Parsons also had “Player-of-the-Week” numbers for MSU Billings. Davis had 10 hits, including four doubles, a triple and a home run, and drove in 10 runs. Parsons was eight for 17, including two doubles and three homers and also drove in 10. MSUB finished the week with a .426 team batting average, scoring 52 runs in its six contests. . .Western Oregon carved out a 0.78 team earned run average in winning four of five road games, including a three-game sweep at Seattle University. Sutherland and Jessica Hallmark, who batted .538 (7 of 13), combined for almost half of WOU's hits (16 of 34) on the road trip. . .Katie Antich batted .455 (10 of 22) combining with Purdy to produce half of Seattle University's hits (21 of 42) in five games. Erin Martin split four decisions, though she allowed just 16 hits and three runs (two earned) in 25 innings. . .Western Washington earned a split of four games despite playing without its No.1 pitcher Jessica Rosencrants because of tendonitis. She is expected to return Friday when the Vikings entertain Northwest Nazarene. WWU was outscored in the four contests 9-7. Sarah McEnroe split two decisions allowing just 11 hits and three runs in 16 2/3 innings. . .Katie Free had seven hits in 17 at bats and a team-best five RBI as Northwest Nazarene split six games, winning one of four with Montana State Billings. Haley Hevern also drove in five runs. .

Holly Morris had five hits in 11 at bats, including a pair of doubles as Saint Martin's won one of four decisions. . Central Washington was outthit 24-11 and outscored 15-4 in losing twice to MSU Billings. Still, the Wildcats found themselves in a virtual three-way tie for first place when the week ended.

**ATHLETES-OF-THE-WEEK:** **Male** – Greg Hamm, Northwest Nazarene (Sr., Hermiston, OR) posted the longest triple jump in the GNAC in four years in the Eastern Oregon Invitational at La Grande. Hamm added 13 inches to his previous career best, set two years ago, in winning the event with a provisional national qualifying leap of 47-5 3/4. It was also the third longest triple jump in GNAC history and the longest since 2004. **Female** – Suzie Strickler, Seattle Pacific (Jr., Richland, WA) cut 18 seconds off her previous provisional national qualifying time in establishing an automatic mark in the women's steeplechase at the 27th annual Ralph Vernacchia Invitational Track and Field Team meet. Strickler was clocked in the steeplechase in a meet-record time of 10:50.24, the second fastest in GNAC history.

**VIKINGS WIN 11<sup>TH</sup> STRAIGHT VERNACCHIA TITLE:** Western Washington claimed its 11th consecutive men's team championship and won its third straight women's team title in the 27<sup>th</sup> annual Vernacchia Invitational team event. Ten GNAC athletes either established or improved on previous national standards at Bellingham. . In addition to Strickler, SPU's Karin Rohde finished second in the steeplechase in a time of 11:17.47, cutting .65 seconds over her previous PNQ. In the women's 800, Jane Larson of SPU finished third in a PNQ of 2:13.72, while her teammate Lisa Anderberg cut .77 seconds off her previous PNQ, placing fourth in a time of 2:14.02. . Heidi Dimmitt of Western Washington won the 400 meter hurdles in a PNQ of 1:02.78. . In the pole vault, Seattle Pacific's Melissa Peaslee added two inches to her previous PNQ in winning the event with a meet-record vault of 12-3 1/2. Christy Miller of WWU established a first-time PNQ with a vault of 11-9 3/4. . In the javelin, Jeeni Schantin and Brittany Aanstad of SPU finished 1-2 improving on their previous automatic marks by two feet and six inches, respectively, with throws of 150-5 and 148-3 and Monica Gruszecki of Western Washington placed fourth, adding nine inches to her previous PNQ with a throw of 144-9. . Strickler, Larson, Peaslee, Schantin and Dimmitt all established GNAC season-best marks in their respective events as did

Megan Zukowski of Western Washington in the 100 and WWU in the 4x100 relay. Zukowski placed second in the sprint race in a time of 12.53. She also ran the anchor leg in the relay as the Vikings finished second in a time of 48.72. . On the men's side, Keith Lemay of Western Washington had the lone GNAC season-best mark winning the 800 in a time of 1:53.39.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** Central Washington's Tyler Fischer had a GNAC season-best discus throw of 158-11 at the Pelluer Invitational track-and-field meet at Cheney. Fischer added 15 inches to his previous conference-leading mark. CWU also had the GNAC's best mark this spring in finishing second in the men's 4x400 relay in a time of 3:21.59. . WOU's Lloyd Massey bettered his previous GNAC-leading time of 53.81 in the 400 hurdles finishing 11th in a time of 53.81 at the UCLA Invitational. . Greg Hamm's triple jump victory at LaGrande was one of 18 for NNU in the meet, including 11 by the Crusader women and seven by the NNU men. Latoya Tidwell (100, 200), Laura VonArx (long jump, triple jump) and Amy Carroll (shot, discus) each won two events for NNU. . Jonathan Hamilton of Central Washington and Bill Richardson of Saint Martin's tied for second in the high jump and the Saints' Sam Washington won the shot put with GNAC season-best performances at the PLU Invitational. Hamilton and Richardson each jumped 6-6, while Washington set a school-record in the shot with a put of 50-8 becoming the seventh athlete in GNAC history to surpass the 50-foot barrier. He also set a school record in winning the discus with a throw of 143-4. GNAC athletes won a total of 13 events in the meet with Washington and Central Washington's Raquel Gonzalez (100 hurdles, 400 hurdles) winning two each.
