GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Nikole Thompson, Seattle University (OH, 5-10, Sr., Marysville, WA – Marysville-Pilchuck) and Courtney Schneider, Western Washington (L, 5-9, Sr., Snohomish, WA). .Thompson, who became the 17th member of the GNAC 1000 Kill Club the previous week, had 38 kills, 29 digs and eight blocks to lead the Redhawks to a road sweep of Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks. Thompson, who is the active GNAC leader in kills, now ranks 15th all-time with 1,046. .Schneider broke her own GNAC single-match record for digs with 50 in the Vikings' 3-1 win over Central Washington, helping hold CWU to a .061 percentage. The

Schneider-led WWU defense limited CWU's Rachael Schurman, who came into the match leading the GNAC with a .379 percentage, to 10 kills and a .104 percentage in 48 attempts. Schneider, who has had 62 consecutive double-digit dig matches, now ranks 11th in NCAA history with 2,177 digs.

HONORABLE MENTION: S. A., Montana State Billings (S, 5-8, Jr., Sofia, Bulgaria – Navarro College) averaged 13.62 assists per game (109 in eight games) as the Yellowjackets hit .227 in extending their win streak to five

matches. .Stacey Bennett, Western Oregon (OH-MB, 6-0, Portland, OR – Westview) hit .441 (29-3-59) in the Wolves' sweeps of Seattle Pacific and Northwest Nazarene. Bennett also had four blocks.

AROUND THE GNAC: Seattle University's Emily Powell had 16 blocks, including a school-record 12 in Saturday's 3-2 win at Alaska Fairbanks as the Redhawks earned their first fifth-game win after five previous losses. Powell's 12 blocks equaled the 2007 GNAC season-best mark and also equaled the second best single-match total in conference history. .Devon Crotteau had 41 kills and Alicia Cazemier had 36 kills, nine blocks and a .382 attack percentage in Montana State Billings' sweep in Alaska. .Western Oregon outhit Seattle Pacific and Northwest Nazarene .254 to .072 as Claire Carpenter led the defense with 43 digs. .Jaime Anderson had 20 kills and Angie Alvord was credited with 10 blocks in Western Washington's win at Central, snapping CWU's three-match win streak. Erin Norris led CWU with 16 kills and seven blocks. .Alyssa Given had 33 kills, 10 aces and 27 digs in six games as Seattle Pacific split a pair of 3-0 road decisions. .Given leads the GNAC with 50 aces (1.00 per game) and is on pace to break the GNAC single-season records for most aces (93) and most aces per game (0.89) set by WWU's Shannon Rowland in 2001. .Cammy Dranginis had team-bests of 22 kills and nine blocks as Northwest Nazarene split two road matches. .Alaska Fairbanks' Megan Thigpen had 33 kills and 29 digs in two home losses. Rhea Cardwell had team-highs of 35 kills and 46 digs for Alaska Anchorage in its 3-1 losses to Seattle and MSU Billings. .Shealun Campisi led Saint Martin's with 23 kills in losses to Northwest Nazarene and Seattle Pacific. The Saints have now lost 27 straight over two seasons.

AROUND THE REGION: The first official NCAA Division II Pacific Regional poll will be announced on Wednesday, Oct. 10. .GNAC teams are 38-40 in non-conference matches. The only two remaining non-conference contests remaining are in Billings as the Yellowjackets play at Rocky Mountain Oct. 2 and host the Bears Nov. 1. .GNAC teams finished 22-25 against Pacific Region opponents, including 17-18 against CCAA teams and 5-7 against the PacWest.

GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK: Amber Easterbrook, Central Washington (GK, 5-5, So., Kent, WA – Kentwood) and Katy McNutt, Northwest Nazarene (F, 5-3, Sr., Vancouver, WA - Evergreen). . Easterbrook had eight saves in recording a shutout in a 3-0 win over regionally eighth-ranked Montana State Billings as the Wildcats snapped a five-game winless streak. McNutt scored four of NNU's six goals, including both game winners, in 3-0 road wins at Western Oregon and Saint Martin's as the Crusaders improved to 3-1 in the GNAC, their best start in conference history. McNutt has eight goals this season and ranks fifth in GNAC history with 38 career goals.

HONORABLE MENTION: Sarah Martinez, Seattle Pacific (F, 5-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Cedar Park Christian) scored four goals, including her third career hat-trick in a 4-2 win at Western Oregon. She leads the GNAC in points with 28 (12 goals, 4 assists) and now ranks third all-time in GNAC career points (107) and second in career goals (44). Martinez and McNutt are the only players in conference history to record three hat-tricks. . Leah Wymer, Seattle (F, 5-6, Sr., Bothell, WA) increased her season total to 12 goals, scoring three times, twice in a 3-1 win at Central Washington. She also had the game-winner in a 1-0 home win over Grand Canyon.

AROUND THE GNAC: Two of Central Washington's three goals in their 3-0 shutout of Montana State Billings came on "own goals" in corner kick situations. Kelsey Penn scored CWU's goal against Seattle, her sixth of the year, but her first since scoring five on CWU's road trip to Hawaii in August. . Danielle Ritter and Mandy Ploskonka had first-half goals for MSUB against Western Washington, but the Vikings scored twice in the second half, including one from Rosie Zadra – her first in 28 games – with 49 seconds left in regulation to earn a tie. . Saturday's shutout was the seventh of the season for Seattle keeper Kaitlyn Jackson. Jackson had eight saves in the Redhawks' two victories. CWU's goal on Thursday against Jackson snapped a 457-minute scoreless streak for the Redhawk goalie. . Ashley Biral and Trisha Halvorson had goals for Saint Martin's in their loss to SPU. . Northwest Nazarene's Amanda Peters had 11 saves in earning her 11th and 12th career shutouts, including three this season. . Kristen Werhane and Chelsie O'Neill scored goals for Western Oregon in its 4-2 loss to Seattle Pacific.

GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK: Wyatt Seddon-Johnstone, Seattle Pacific (M, 6-2, Jr., Burnaby, BC – Burnaby Central & Hartwick) led the Falcons to a pair of 1-1 draws as he energized the midfield during the second half as the Falcons came behind against Montana State Billings. He then had another strong game, winning balls and restarting the attack, in a defensive center role against Grand Canyon.

AROUND THE GNAC: John Fishbaugher scored the only goal in Seattle University's 1-0 win at Western Washington. . Sam Charles scored Montana State Billings' goal in its 1-1 tie at Seattle Pacific, extending his school-record and GNAC consecutive game goals streak to eight. The streak, however, came to an end in Saturday's 3-0 loss at Western Washington as the Yellowjackets' two-season unbeaten streak was halted at nine. . Matt Kemper and James Coggan scored Seattle Pacific's goals in their two 1-1 draws. SPU has played four consecutive 1-1 ties. . Freshman Gibson Bardsley, Samir Vejo and Chris Jepson had goals in Western Washington's home win over MSUB. Bardsley has a team-best five goals, the most for a Viking freshman since 1985.

GNAC ATHLETES-OF-THE-WEEK: Men – Bennett Grimes, Western Washington (Fr., Pocatello, ID – Century) had the only Top 10 finish by a GNAC male athlete in the Bob Firman Invitational at Eagle Island State Park in Boise. Grimes finished seventh in a four-mile time of 25:41, only 23 seconds in back of the winner. He is the third different Viking runner to lead WWU in a race this fall. **Women** – Ashley Puga, Northwest Nazarene (Jr., Boise, ID – Nampa Christian) and Marcie Mullen, Central Washington (Jr., Sedro-Woolley, WA). . Puga finished fourth at Boise finishing behind only Seattle Pacific's Jessica Pixler and two Division I athletes, in a time of 18:31. Mullen, who redshirted a year ago, earned her second win of the season, finishing first in the CWU Apperidge Run in a 5,000 meter time of 19:12.

AROUND THE GNAC: Pixler earned her sixth career win in eight starts (two this year) at Eagle Island as Seattle Pacific tied Chico State for second-place in a possible preview of November's NCAA Division II West Regional, which will be run on the same course. Pixler ran the 5,000-meter layout in 18:00.44. The regional course will be stretched out to 6,000-meters. . Central Washington's Sam Scotchmer and Saint Martin's John Riak earned wins at their home meets. For Riak, it was his third win in three races this fall.

GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK: Jake Koppenberg, Western Washington (Jr., Everett, WA), a transfer from the University of Idaho, carded rounds of 70 and 64 to finish with a

eight-under-par 134 total in the Saint Martin's Invitational. Koppenberg finished second and also led the Vikings to a second-place team finish in the 36-hole event.
