GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Alyssa Given, Seattle Pacific (OH, 5-10, Sr., Salinas, CA) and Tiana Roma, Western Washington (MB, 6-0, Jr., Edmonds, WA – Edmonds-Woodway). . . Given had 49 kills and hit for a .312 percentage in establishing a SPU career-record for kills as the Falcons split a pair of 3-2 matches. Given also had a team-best eight blocks, 19 digs and three aces. She currently leads the GNAC in kills (4.47), aces (53) and points (5.67). She ranks sixth in GNAC history in career kills (1,261) and needs to average 18.2 kills in SPU's final

11 regular-season matches to move into first-place on the conference's all-time career chart. She is also just 10 aces away from the GNAC career record of 182 by Erika Brunson of Seattle, who set the record between 2001 and 2004. . .Roma had 20 kills, a team-best six blocks and a .320 hitting percentage. Many of her kills and blocks were in key situations as Western Washington swept road contests at Billings and Seattle.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** Megan Thigpen, Alaska Fairbanks (MH, 5-10, So., Spokane, WA - Mead) had 42 kills and 34 digs as the Nanooks came within two points of earning a sweep at Nampa and Brougham Pavilion, winning the fifth game with NNU 15-12 before losing Game 5 to Seattle University 16-14. Thigpen had 18 kills including the match point against the Crusaders, then added 24 more kills at SPU.

AROUND THE GNAC: Western Washington was the only conference team to post a 2-0 record last week. The Vikings have won five straight matches, winning 15 of 16 games, since a 3-2 loss at Western Oregon. Emily Castro had 26 kills and 24 digs in the two victories, while setter Katie Robinson had 73 assists as WWU doubled its opponents hitting percentage (.220 to .110). Libero Courtney Schneider had 45 more digs, moving into ninth place on the NCAA Division II all-time career chart with 2,222. . . Given and Angie Wodrich (39) combined for 88 kills, 66.2 percent of SPU's team total in their two matches. . .Six players had between 12 and 24 kills, including Loni Evenson with 24, Chelsea Pelton with 22 and Cammy Dranginis with 21, as Northwest Nazarene split two matches. Dranginis also had 10 blocks. . .Jennifer Boe and Devon Crotteau each had 23 kills and Alicia Cazemier had 22 as Montana State Billings split two matches. Both Crotteau and Cazemier had 13-match streaks with 10 or more kills snapped in Thursday's 3-0 loss to Western Washington. . . Rachael Schurman had 32 kills and Kady Try had 26 as the Wildcats earned a road split, despite being outhit .184 to .114. Schurman also had 15 blocks and accounted for 40.5 of CWU's 138 points. . . Rhea Cardwell had 21 kills, while Joanna Johnson, Kim Stolk and Rachel Kidwell had 20, 19 and 18, respectively, as Alaska Anchorage split two matches, winning at SPU for the first time since 2003 in ending a five-match losing streak. . .Seattle University's Nikole Thompson had 30 kills and 25 digs increasing her career kill total to 1,076. . .Kayla Mainer had 21 kills and 19 digs as Western Oregon maintained a tie for first-place in the GNAC with a 3-1 win over Saint Martin's. The Saints got 14 kills and 21 digs from Shealun Campisi, but fell for the 28th straight time.

**AROUND THE REGION**: The first official NCAA Division II Pacific Regional poll will be announced on Wednesday, Oct. 10. . .GNAC teams are 38-40 in non-conference matches. The only two remaining non-conference contests remaining are in Billings as the Yellowjackets play at Rocky Mountain Tuesday and host the Bears Nov. 1. . .GNAC teams finished 22-25 against Pacific Region opponents, including 17-18 against CCAA teams and 5-7 against the PacWest.

GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK: Jocelyn Charette, Seattle Pacific (F, 5-10, So., Lakewood, WA) and Teresa Fish, Western Washington (GK, 5-7, Sr., Snohomish, WA-Monroe). . .Charette, a transfer from the University of Tampa, was a key component in the Falcons' 2-1 over Seattle University Saturday, earning an assist on Shannon Oakes' first-half goal and then getting the game-winner in overtime. She had a team-high five shots including a free kick in the second half that forced a diving save by Redhawk keeper Kaitlyn Jackson. She also took three

shots in SPU's 1-0 shutout of Montana State Billings on Thursday. . Fish had eight saves in posting two shutouts – her 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of her career – in 3-0 and 4-0 road wins at Western Oregon and Saint Martin's. Fish, who has seven shutouts this season, is now the GNAC's all-time career leader. She previously shared the record of 25 with Seattle Pacific's Jennifer Hull (2001-04).

HONORABLE MENTION: Claire Morgan, Western Washington (F, 5-7, Fr., Bellingham, WA) had a goal and three assists in the Vikings' two victories. Her three assists all came against Saint Martin's as she tied the WWU school and GNAC single-game record for most assists. She is the ninth player in conference history to accomplish the feat which has been done 10 times, including twice by Ashley Porter. Three of the occurrences have been this season. Brittney Sandau, Montana State Billings (5-4, Sr., Billings, MT – West) had two of the Yellowjackets' three goals in a 3-1 win at Northwest Nazarene, its first conference road victory of the season. The goals were Sandau's sixth and seventh of the season and 26th and 27th of her career. She is currently fourth in school history for both career goals and career points.

AROUND THE GNAC: Sarah Martinez equaled the GNAC career record with her 45<sup>th</sup> career goal in Seattle Pacific's home win over Montana State Billings. Nichole Sauvageau also had 45 goals for Seattle University between 1999 and 2002. Martinez has 109 career points, two short of the conference record held by SPU's Shannon Lovejoy (2002-05). . .Kara Kuttler and Jasmine Wilson scored goals as Seattle University split a pair of one-goal decisions beating Northwest Nazarene 1-0 before losing to SPU. . . Central Washington's Amber Easterbrook extended her string of consecutive minutes without allowing a goal to 327:21 before Jill Petersen scored in overtime in Western Oregon's 1-0 win Sunday. Easterbrook's streak included shutout wins over MSU Billings and Saint Martin's. She had eight saves against SMU and WOU before allowing the game-winner. On Thursday, Kelsey Penn scored CWU's gamewinner against Saint Martin's. It was her team-leading seventh goal of the season and her second game-winner. . .Jordan Fenwick had 17 saves in Montana State Billings' 1-0 loss at SPU. Her total is the second most in GNAC history and the most-ever in a game decided by three or fewer goals. . . Hannah Mohs had Northwest Nazarene's lone goal in a pair of home losses to Seattle and MSU Billings. . . Saint Martin's keepers Michelle Donachie (11) and Breanna Klasen (10) combined for 21 saves in a pair of home losses. The Saints have now lost seven straight since their lone win on Sept. 1 against Notre Dame de Namur.

**GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK:** Jason Cascio, Seattle University (F, 5-11, Sr., Gilbert, AZ - Hamilton) scored all three of the Redhawk goals in wins over Montana State Billings (1-0) and UC San Diego (2-0). The goal against the Yellowjackets came in overtime. Cascio, who led the GNAC with 16 goals last season, has five so far this season.

AROUND THE GNAC: Cascio moved into 10<sup>th</sup> place on the GNAC career point list and into sixth on the career goal list with 52 and 23, respectively, with his three goals. Cascio played most of his first two seasons with the Redhawks in more of a defensive role and had only two goals in 41 games. But, since moving to forward he has scored 21 goals in 29 contests. . Emerson DeOliveira (1 save) and Jordan Jennings (2 saves) each had shutouts in SU's two wins, but needed to make just three saves between them. On the season, DeOliveira has four shutouts and Jennings has two. . . Gibson Bardsley and Matt Pele each had a goal and an assist as Western Washington won a pair of games. Five different players had goals in the two contests. Michael Lockwood had 10 saves in earning a pair of wins. . . Sam Charles had two goals and Jarred Weisen

had three assists in Montana State Billings' 5-1 win over Colorado Christian. With his 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> goals on the season, Charles is already 24<sup>th</sup> on the GNAC *Career* Scoring chart in MSUB's first season in the conference. . . Weisen is the seventh GNAC player to record three assists in a game. Last year Dustin Allbery of Seattle had four against Chaminade. No player has had more than two in a conference contest. . . Seattle University and Western Washington each have won their last three contests. Seattle Pacific is winless in its last six starts, losing twice after battling to four consecutive 1-1 draws. Saint Martin's has lost six straight. Chase Franklin scored SMU's lone goal in its loss to Western Washington.

**GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK:** Sean Packer, Western Washington (Sr., Sumner, WA – Auburn-Riverside) finished seventh in the Western Washington Invitational with a three-under par 54-hole total of 213, including a tournament-best 65 in the second round. After two tournaments, Packer leads the GNAC with a stroke average of 70.2 for five rounds.
