## IN THE BATTER'S BOX

MSUB begins its first season in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference at the Lewis-Clark State Tournament this weekend. The Yellowjackets are scheduled to open the 2008 season against NAIA foe University of British Columbia. Host and defending NAIA champion Lewis-Clark State College also will be on the ticket. In addition, MSUB will get a look at two of the GNAC schools in defending champion Western Oregon and Saint Martin's.

### THE SERIES'

The Yellowjackets have not faced any of the four teams in this tournament since baseball added as a sport in 2006.

# MONTANA STATE BILLINGS

The Yellowiackets begin their third season since baseball was reinstated in 2006. MSUB welcomes back 11 letterwinners from last season's 24-26 squad that finished 16-20 in the Heartland Conference. Head coach Chris Brown is in his third year at the helm of the Yellowjacket program. He welcomes back two starters and three pitchers from 2007. The Jackets have a number of new faces throughout their lineup and will rely on the services of senior Seth Moir and sophomore Matt Schoonover to provide the leadership and experience in the field. Schoonover was a first team all-conference selection as a freshman last year. On the bump, the Yellowjackets have three players who saw significant time last year. Senior Jeremy Knowles and juniors Brian Strom and Steve Scott all look to make an immediate impact in the GNAC.

## UNIVERSITY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

The Thunderbirds enter the season with a record of 4-2. UBC, a NAIA member, finished the 2007 season with a 21-20 record and an 18-9 record in conference play. UBC went to the NAIA Region I tournament last year and went 0-2. UBC started the season 0-2, but have won four straight.

# LEWIS-CLARK STATE

The Warriors enter the tournament with a 6-2 record after going 3-1 in the Regence Blue Shield of Idaho Classic this past weekend. Lewis-Clark, the defending, NAIA National Champion, is led by Brent Wyatt who is hitting .407 through the first eight games. He leads the team with 11 hits and nine RBI. He also has one home run. As a team, LCSC is hitting .324 compared to its opponents .204. On the hill, the Warriors have an ERA of 1.85 led by Matt Fitts (2-0, 2.45) and Nick Masters (2-0, 2.84). Both losses for the Warriors this season have been by one run.

# **WESTERN OREGON**

The Wolves enter the week with a 6-7 record after splitting four games against San Francisco State this past weekend. WOU, picked as Great Northwest Athletic Conference favorite, is led by Cesar Lopes who is batting .378. Lopes leads the team in hits with 14 and is second on the squad in RBI's with seven. As a team, the Wolves are hitting .250 for the year, while their opponents are batting .288. On the mound, the Wolves have a 4.46 ERA while their opponents card a 2.95 ERA. Greg Bobnick has been the most consist ant starter, go-



ing 2-2 with a 3.38 ERA.

### SAINT MARTIN'S

The Saints enter the week with a 2-2 record after splitting four games at California State Monterrey Bay last weekend. Shane Schoeneber leads the team with a .500 average, including eight hits, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI. As a team, SMU is hitting .299 compared to its opponents' .274 average. On the hill, SMU is led by Pat Capone who has a 4.50 ERA with one start and a 1-0 record. The Saints were picked to finish fifth in the GNAC this season.

### LAST TO START...FIRST TO BEGIN

Of the field in the Lewis-Clark State Tournament, MSUB is the last to begin its season. WOU already has played 13 games, while LCSC has played eight, by the time the tournament begins on Friday, UBC will have played seven games and St. Martin's has played four. Ironically, MSUB and UBC will be the first teams in action in the tournament on Friday at 10 a.m.

## **2008 OUTLOOK**

Montana State Billings Yellowjackets baseball team is poised to begin its inaugural season in the Great Northwest Atlantic Conference under the direction of thirdyear head coach Chris Brown which was reinstated three years ago following an absence of 30 years. Assistant coach Luke Wheeler is in his second season with the program. The move to the GNAC comes on the heels of a fourth-place Yellowjacket finish in the Heartland Conference, with a 16-20 league record and overall season of

The excitement is palpable as the Yellowjackets prepare to compete in the GNAC against such teams as Central Washington, St. Martin's, Northwest Nazarene and Western Oregon University in conference play. Coach Brown believes the GNAC is a good fit for the 'Jackets, as it's geographically a little closer and levels the playing field by including teams that battle the same types of weather-related issues that MSUB regularly encounters.

Coach Brown sees the GNAC as a more hitter-dominant style of play than the Heartland. "Our move could be compared to going from the National League to the American League," said Brown. "We won't change the way we play, but will continue to play good defense and drive the ball gap to gap. We plan to stretch the defense offensively and come out aggressively on the base paths. Good pitching beats good hitting every day. All in all, it will be a good fit for us."

Despite losing all but two position players and a majority of the staff to graduation, the Yellowjackets return 11 letter winners from a year ago and four starters. While former shortstop talent Kyle Pryor, capable catcher Jake Samuelson, and outstanding pitcher Ben Lewerke will be sorely missed this season, along with much of the Yellowjacket outfield, Brown is looking positively upon a solid core of returning veterans and an array of talented recruits.

"Defensively we should be able to pick it and throw it with anyone," said Brown. "We've got six to seven glove guys that can pick and throw, and in the outfield we shouldn't have many balls drop. Defense and our team speed is as good as any I have coached. We will be aggressive on the bases and look to steal when the opportunity presents itself."

Depth is also a strong point for the 2008 'Jackets. "On paper this is the most talent and depth we have had since I have been here," Brown said. "I honestly think we are two-deep at every position and that's a good thing when not having a lot of returners at a lot of positions."

MSUB returns its top two hitters off of that team and three of its top four pitchers in terms of earned run average (minimum 30 innings). Second baseman Matt Schoonover batted .378 and had four home runs and 24 RBI last season to earn first team Heartland all-conference honors, while first baseman Seth Moir, who started his career at Saint Martin's, hit .333 and had two home runs and 26 RBI.

Six pitchers return from MSUB's 2007 staff that had a 5.56 earned run average, including Brian Strom, who made nine starts and had a 4-5 record and 4.88 earned run average, and Jeremy Knowles, who started eight games and had a 1-4

record and 6.02 ERA.

Among the newcomers for the Yellowjackets are one four-year transfer and three JC all-stars. Junior College recruit, infielder Cole Pryor, earned conference and region MVP honors at Miles CC. Pryor, whose brother Kyle batted .328 and led the 'Jackets in stolen bases last season

#### JACKETS THIRD

The Yellowjackets were picked third in the preseason GNAC poll. Western Oregon was tabbed league favorite, followed by Central Washington, MSUB, Northwest Nazarene and Saint Martin's.

## **NEW FACES A PLENTY**

The Yellowjackets have a number of new faces this season. All but two position players are new, including an entirely new outfield. Though most of the team is new, there is a lot of talent in the new players. Overall, MSUB has 17 new players.

## PIRTZ FIELD IS HOME

While renovation is being done on Cobb Field this season, the Yellowjackets will play all of their home games at Pitrz Field in Billings. MSUB will be back at Cobb Field in 2009.

# 2007 REVIEW

In just the program's second season the Montana State Billings baseball team proved to be worthy opponents in the very competitive Heartland Conference finishing fourth in the league with a 16-20 record. Overall the Jackets ended the season just below .500 at 24-26.

It is always tough opening the season on the road, but it is part of life if you call Billings, Mont., home. The Yellowjackets started their campaign with 10 games in Texas. The team's first four-game series of the trip came against reigning Heartland Conference Champion University of the Incarnate Word. The Jackets' Ben Lewerke (Mason City, IA) lifted the team to a 5-1 victory in game four after MSUB dropped the first three in the series. Heading down to the border, the Yellowjackets split wins with provisional conference member Texas A&M - International before going 1-3 against St. Mary's University.

With less than a week between trips, the Jackets headed back to the Lone Star State for games against St. Edward's and Texas – Permian Basin with a side trip to Goodwell, Okla., to play against Panhandle State. In the first four-game series, St. Edward's swept the Jackets in Austin – the only team to do so throughout the season – to drop the Yellowjackets' record to 3-11. The Jackets then rebounded with eight-straight wins against Permian Basin and Oklahoma Panhandle to pull to an even 11-11. The eight-straight were a school record for consecutive victories. The Jackets also played their longest game in school history in a 4-3 12-inning win over the Falcons.

A quick trip over to Ellensburg, Wash. to face future Great Northwest Athletic Conference opponent Central Washington University saw the Jackets split the series with the Wildcats to hold steady at .500.

The Yellowjackets wrapped up their road schedule against Lincoln University. Taking three games from the Blue Tigers, the Jackets broke away from the .500 mark to move to 16-14. In the game Jake Samuelson (Helena, MT) powered a grand slam, the program's first ever, in the seventh inning to earn the dramatic win for the Yellowjackets. That was March 25. With MSUB looking to open a 24-game home stand March 31, Mother Nature reared her head forcing the Yellowjackets to cancel eight-straight games pushing back opening day at Cobb Field to April 13.

After nearly three weeks of idleness, the Jackets finally got the chance to treat the fans to a double-dose of spring baseball. Playing regularly scheduled games against Lincoln University, the Jackets added four games against NAIA opponent Jamestown College to make up games lost due to the storm. The four-day eight-game run was rough for the Yellowjackets. MSUB split wins with the Blue Tigers before going 1-3 against the 2006 Region III Champion Jimmies.

A 5-1 win over the Rattlers put a stop to the Yellowjackets' five-game losing streak. With perhaps the team's toughest eight games remaining to wrap up the season, the veteran squad took things in stride splitting wins with Incarnate Word. Seth Moir's (Cody, WY) two-RBI double in the bottom of the sixth tied the game and was won when Moir scored later in the inning.

In the final four-game series of the season the Yellowjackets shocked St. Edward's University using late game surges to take two wins from the Hilltoppers. The Jackets' Doug Longfellow (Lewistown, MT) used just his second career home run to lift the Yellowjackets to a 9-8 walk-off win delaying the Hilltoppers' outright conference title one more day. St. Edward's clinched the title with a win in game one on Saturday, but the Yellowjackets had the final say in closing out a two-year run in the Heartland Conference. A fifth-inning grand slam by Josh Wiley (Belgrade, MT)

thrust the Jackets into the lead which they held onto for the 10-8 win. The Yellowjackets finished the season just twogames shy of .500; not bad for a second year program.

"Our successes this year cannot be measured in statistics, awards, or records", said Yellowjacket head coach Chris Brown. "The team as a whole took a huge step forward and really set the tone for the years ahead. They started to do the little things in practice, on their own, and in game situations that really made the difference."

The Yellowjackets' 14 seniors played a key role in many aspects for the team. Whether it was skill, patience, or resilience, the seniors brought much to the diamond for the Jackets that Coach Brown will look to replace.

"Trying to replace the seniors from this year will not be easy," added Brown.

"They were good players and leaders. I will look internally for our new leaders. We have some guys that will be entering their third year in the program and know what it is all about. I will look to them to fill the seniors' shoes."

Kyle Pryor (Billings, MT) was steady all season leading the Yellowjackets in runs (42), hits (49), stolen bases (17), and on base percentage (.474). Pryor stood atop the conference standings drawing 40 walks, ranking him 19th nationally for walks per game (.82). He also ranked in the top four for stolen bases and on base percentage in the Heartland. Will Crtalic (Billings, MT) finished the season ranked in a tie for third in the conference with his team-leading 14 doubles, while Nick Hoskyn (Oelwein, IA) and Longfellow ranked sixth for stolen bases (14) and seventh for triples (3) respectively. Freshman Matt Schoonover (Great Falls, MT) was a dangerous factor at the plate batting .378 to lead the Jackets. His .555 slugging percentage and four home runs also led the Yellowjackets.

Lewerke was the Jackets' driving force

on the mound. Ranked as high as 10th in the nation for earned run average in Division II, the southpaw finished his senior season ranked second in the conference with a 2.74 ERA. Known for throwing pitches that resulted in ground balls, the combination of Lewerke and his defense earned him a 7-1 record.

"Next year we will look to Brian Strom, Jeremy Knowles, James Lester, Cody Clark, Steve Scott, and Mike Cease to be the core of our pitching staff," said Brown. "In the field and at the plate we are looking for Schoonover and Moir to pick up where they left off and to keep improving. I also expect Patch Wirtzberger, Jordan Shine, and Kyle Ailes to step into significant roles next season."

The Yellowjackets shattered nearly every team record set in the inaugural season. The obvious was the nine more wins posted by the team over the 2006 record. The Jackets' pitching staff finished the season ranked third in the conference with a 5.56 ERA. At the plate, MSU Billings hit 13 more doubles, two additional triples, and a whopping 12 more home runs than in the preceding season. The team also scored 31 more runs and drove in 35 more RBIs than in 2006.

The Jackets' ERA was lowered from 7.98 in 2006 to a 5.56 in 2007. Mike Cease's (Deer Lodge, MT) team and conference-leading six saves ranked him 35th nationally, while Strom was ranked third in the conference for shutouts (2), and fifth for opponent's batting average (.262).

The Yellowjackets were also successful in catching multiple honors and awards. Schoonover was named the Heartland hitter of the week, while his pitching counterparts picked up four pitcher of the week honors. Lewerke was twice named to the honor with Strom and Cease also garnering the award.

Six Jackets were selected to the All-Heartland Conference team. Lewerke, Schoonover, and Pryor were first team selections with Cease, Samuelson, and Hoskyn named to the second team. Lewerke was also named to the Daktronics Division II All-South Central Region second team. He was just one of only three selected from the Heartland Conference.

Excitement is brewing for MSU Billings as the Yellowjackets will make the change to the Great Northwest Athletic Conference July 1. The Jackets' baseball team will compete against Central Washington, St. Martin's, Northwest Nazarene, and Western Oregon University in conference play.

"Our goals and expectations will not change heading into the GNAC," said Brown. "We have the expectation that we still step into the league and be in the mix from the start. As a program, we look to continue taking steps forward and establishing a tradition that everyone involved in the Yellowjacket Baseball program can be proud of."

# Head Coach Chris Brown



Chris Brown is entering his third season at the helm of the Yellowjacket baseball program in 2007-2008. In his first season, the team went 15-35 overall and 13-27

in the Heartland Conference. In the Jackets' second year of competition, they were 24-26 overall and 16-20 in the conference. He has a 39-61 record at MSUB and a career mark of 68-126.

Brown was the head coach for two seasons at Bemidji State University, a Division II school in Bemidji, Minn., but left the Beavers immediately to begin recruiting at MSU Billings. At Bemidji, Brown was the first coach in the program's 54 year history to post back-to-back seasons of more than 10 conference wins.

Before he was promoted to head coach in the summer of 2002 and was an assistant coach at Bemidji State for two years. As an assistant, he served as the team's recruiting coordinator and pitching coach. He spent one season as an assistant coach at Jamestown College (ND), where he was a pitcher for four years and graduated in 2000.

During the summers, Brown has taken USA baseball team of mostly college seniors who have completed their eligibility and did not get drafted overseas to compete in different tournaments. Most notably, he went to the World Down Under Games in Australia where his team won a gold medal. Over the summer, he has taken teams to Belgium, Prague, Holland and Aruba.

He and his wife Heather (Kelley) have one son named Brevik who is five months old.

# Assistant Coach Luke Wheeler



Luke Wheeler is in his second season as the Yellowjacket baseball team's assistant coach in 2007-2008. Wheeler's primary responsibilities include coaching the

infielders and hitters.

Prior to coming to MSUB, Luke spent four seasons as an assistant coach at

Northeastern Junior College in Sterling, CO, one season at National American University in Rapid City, SD, and one season as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma Christian University. While at OC, he received his bachelors degree in physical education.

Wheeler's playing experiences include two years at Seward County Community College. He then signed and played one year at the University of Southern Mississippi. After one year, he transferred to Oklahoma Christian University and finished his senior season.
