MSUB WOMEN'S SOCCER
2008 Game Notes

BRIEFLY

MSUB returns home for the final home game of the season against No. 18 and West Region top seed, Western Washington Friday at 1 p.m. at the College of Technology Field. The Yellowjackets stand at 9-8 overall and 4-5 in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference. WWU enters with a 13-2-1 record and an 8-0-1 record in conference play.

FIRST LIVE WEBCAST

The Yellowjackets women's soccer team will have its first home game broadcast live on the internet against Western Washington Friday. The game will be FREE of charge and fans can access the game by logging on to www.msubillings.edu/athletics and clicking on live broadcasts. All men's and women's home soccer games are scheduled to be broadcast live on the internet in 2009.

SCOUTING MSUB

The Montana State Billings Yellowjacket women's soccer team enters the week with a 9-8 record and a 4-5 record in conference play. The Yellowjackets split two games last week with a 3-0 loss at Western Oregon and rebounded for a 2-1 overtime victory at Saint Martin's. Senior Sara Gress scored the game winner in the 96th minute on an assist from Ali Gamberg.

Leading the way for the Jackets this season is Kari Foreman, who has five goals, two assists and 12 points thus far. She is third on the team with 27 shots and second on the team with 18 on goal and has two games winners. Ali Gamberg is second on the team with 12 points courtesy of four goals and four assists. Gamberg has one game winner and leads the team with 37 shots and 25 on goal. In addition, she has scored three goals and tallied two assists in the past five games. She had just one score in the first 12 contests. Melissa Carlson, Chelsea Libby and Mandy Ploskonka each have three goals, while Ploskonka, Samantha Sandau and Gamberg lead the team with four assists each.

In goal, the Jackets are led by Jordan Fenwick who has played and started in 15 games. She has a 8-7 record with three shut-outs to go along with a 1.73 goals against average and 69 saves. She has allowed 25 goals on the year. Brittany Knudtson has two starts this season and both were against Western Oregon. She carries a 1-1 record with a 1.40 gaa and seven saves and has played in a total of five games this season.

RECAPPING LAST WEEK

The Yellowjackets split two games last week as they dropped a 3-0 decision at Western Oregon and won a hard-fought 2-1 overtime decision at Saint Martin's to sweep the series. MSUB got behind early against WOU and was unable to recover in a 3-0 loss. WOU out-shot the 'Jackets 16-8. The Wolves held a 1-0 lead at halftime and scored two goals in a span of 10:30 midway through the second half to take command. The Yellowjackets rebounded with a 2-1 overtime victory at Saint Martin's

last Saturday. Senior Mandy Ploskonka opened the scoring in the 23rd minute and the Jackets held a 1-0 lead at intermission, but SMU would answer in the 77th minute off a corner kick. Not to be out done, the Jackets had the last laugh again against Saint Martin's as senior defender Sara Gress drove almost the entire length of the field and scored off a great assist from Ali Gamberg in the 96th minute.

SCOUTING WESTERN WASHINGTON

The Vikings enter the week as the top seed in the West Region and conference leader with a 13-2-1 record and a 8-0-1 record in conference play. WWU enters the winners of three straight and currently own an 11-game unbeaten streak, (10-0-1). Nationally, the Vikings are ranked 18th according to the latest NSCAA/adidas Coaches Poll.

Leading the way for WWU this season is Claire Morgan who leads the team with eight goals, seven assists and 23 points. She also leads the team with 65 shots and 25 on goal and has four game winners. Molly Shannon is second on the squad with seven goals and two assists with two game winners. Lucy Miller is third in goals with six to lead the balanced offensive attack.

In goal, the Vikings are led by Kylie Broadbent who has played and started in all 16 games. She has a 13-2-1 record with six shutouts and 70 saves. She leads the league with a 0.73 goals against average in 1475:32 minutes of action and only has allowed 12 goals thus far.

INSIDE THE SERIES

The Vikings own a 5-0-1 record in the series that dates back to 1998. WWU won a 2-0 decision earlier this season in Bellingham and went 1-0-1 against the Yellowjackets

last year as the teams played to a 2-2 draw in Bellingham and WWU won 2-0 in Billings.

CARLSON ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Senior Melissa Carlson was named to the first team CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District team Thursday. Carlson, a midfielder from Renton, Wash., is a health and human performance major and carries a 3.92 grade point average. She currently is tied for third on the team with three goals and has two assists for eight points.

FIRST WIN IN WASHINGTON

The 2-1 overtime victory at Saint Martin's last week was the first victory for the women's soccer program against a Division II opponent in the state of Washington in school history.

FANS, FANS AND MORE FANS

The Oct. 18 3-2 overtime loss to arch-rival Rocky Mountain College set the record for the third largest crowd in school history with 323. It does, however, mark the largest crowd at the College of Technology Field. The largest crowd of 423 also was against Rocky, Sept. 20, 2006, at Daylis Stadium as was the second largest of 378 last season (Oct. 3) against Rocky at Daylis as well.

CONDITIONED FOR OVERTIME

The Yellowjackets stand at 3-1 in overtime games this season. Most recently, the Jackets need extra time to defeat Saint Martin's 2-1 last weekend. Sara Gress scored the game winner in the 96th minute for the Jackets. In addition, the Jackets won overtime games versus Fort Lewis (2-1) and Saint Martin's in Billings coming from two goals down in the final seven minutes of regulation for a 3-2 overtime win. Rocky posted a heartbreaking 3-2 overtime victory over MSUB Oct. 18 in the Seventh Annual Rimrock Cup.

NEW FOUND RIVAL?

This season, the Yellowjackets and Saints of Saint Martin's have had two incredible games. First, MSUB rallied from a 2-0 deficit in the final seven minutes of regulation to tie the game with just 19 seconds left in regulation and then to cap it off, scored the game winner with 23 seconds left in the first overtime period for a 3-2 victory in Billings. To make it even more thrilling, the Jackets returned the favor last week at Saint Martin's taking the early lead to only see it vanish midway through the second half. Sara Gress scored the game winner midway through the first overtime as she made an impressive run down the field and pass from Ali Gamberg for the game winner, 2-1.

DA ALI G SHOW

Ali Gamberg has been impressive in the last five games. She has three goals and two assists during that span. Prior to the last five games, she had just one goal in the first 12. Most recently, she added the game winning assist in overtime as MSUB downed Saint Martin's last week, 2-1 in overtime. Don Trentham enters his seventh year as head women's soccer coach at MSU Billings in 2008. Under Trentham's direction the

program has gone 53-49-8. He is the most successful coach in the history of the program in terms of both total wins and winning percentage, and his teams have posted the only three winning seasons in team history. In addition to his role as the head women's coach, Trentham is in charge of the fundraising and the development of Yellowjacket Field, which in the spring of 2008 received a facelift with the addition of a state-of-the-art synthetic turf playing field.

Trentham attended Columbia College (Missouri) and played for head coach Dan Hogan, who is now head coach at University of Southern Indiana. At Columbia he was part of an NAIA program that was consistently ranked in the top-20, won two conference tournament championships and twice advanced to the regional tournament. In his senior year, the team finished 17-5 and was ranked ninth in the nation.

Trentham began his collegiate coaching career as an assistant at Embry-Riddle University in Daytona Beach, Florida where he had the chance to work two seasons with one of the finest soccer tacticians in the country – David Gregson. At Embry-Riddle he assisted in guiding the team to a #16 NAIA National Ranking in the final poll of 1999 season, two NAIA Regional Tournament appearances and a Florida Sun Conference regular season championship.

"I've been very fortunate to have played for and coached with two great people," says Trentham. "Much of what I learned about the game came from Coach Hogan and David Gregson. Had it not been for those guys, I don't know if I'd be

coaching today."

Aside from his head coaching duties with the team at MSU Billings, Trentham also plays an active role in developing players throughout the state and the region. Over the past three years he has served as the u13 and u14 girls head coach for the Magic City Soccer Club, guiding three teams to Montana State Youth Soccer Championships. In the past he has also coached in the Olympic Development Program serving as the ODP girl's head coach for Montana, as well as an ODP staff coach for Region IV. Furthermore, he holds many camps, clinics, tournaments, and leagues during the course of the year for both adult and youth players throughout the state.

Trentham earned his Bachelor of Arts in Education from Columbia College and a Master of Education in Sport Management from East Stroudsburg University. He holds an "A" and "National Goalkeeping" licenses from the United States Soccer Federation, as well as an Advanced National license from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.



The 2008 season will be Stroup's second as the Yellowjackets' women's soccer assistant coach. She is a 2007 cum laude graduate

from MSU Billings, earning a Bachelor of Arts Degree in psychology with a minor in coaching.

"Ally continues to be a valuable asset to the soccer program here at MSUB," said Head Coach Don Trentham. "She has worked very hard the past year in making the transition from player to coach and is settling in nicely in her role as assistant coach. She knows the game very well and has a tremendous passion for MSUB soccer, and it is exciting to watch her pass on that knowledge and passion to the players."

As a player, Stroup was a four year

starter and two-time captain for the Yellowjackets. Her freshmen season she was named to the NSCAA/adidas All-West Region Second Team. As a junior, she received the following honors: MSU Billings Most Valuable Student-Athlete, Heartland all-conference team, scholar-athlete by her teammates, and ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VII Second Team. For her senior season, she received the following honors: ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VII second team, Dakrtonics all-Midwest Region, scholar-athlete and MVP by her teammates, NSCAA/adidas College Scholar all-West Region team, NSCAA/adidas Women's Soccer Scholar All-America College Division First Team.

At one point during her senior season, the team was ranked No. 1 in the Midwest Region and ranked nationally in the top 10. Stroup finished her MSU Billings career as the school record holder for career goals, assists, points, game winning goals, and games started.

Stroup is also very active with the Magic City Soccer Club. Since the spring of 2004, she has coached teams ranging in ages from girls u12 to girls u15. This past spring Stroup helped coach the girls' u13 and u14 teams, and will continue with the u14 team in the spring of 2009 through their u15 season. She also serves as the Assistant Camp Director for Yellowjacket Soccer Camps.

Stroup holds a USSF National "C" Coaching License and is currently a graduate student at MSU Billings pursuing a degree in Master of Education - School Counseling Option. She is married to Garret Stroup, a 2006 graduate of MSU Billings.
