- Career Services launched its Employer Partnership Program. Starting July 1, 2008, employer partners will have increased campus visibility for 12 months.

- CareerLink, established in August 2006, now serves over 1,600 candidates and 1,500+ employers who have posted over 3,300 FT and PT jobs.
