What are the average annual wages and potential lifetime earnings for professionals working in the Criminal Justice field?

Occupation	Annual wage range in MT*	Potential lifetime earnings*
Police & Sheriff Officer	\$59,020 - \$68,220	\$72,280 x 39 yrs = \$2,818,920
Correctional Officer	\$46,830 - \$51,620	\$53,300 x 39 yrs = \$2,078,700
Probation Officer	\$46,870 - \$60,010	\$61,800 x 39 yrs = \$2,410,200
Fish & Game Warden	\$61,370 - \$69,420	\$60,380 x 39 yrs = 2,354,820

What percentage of Criminal Justice graduates report having a job after graduating?

Out of the 14% of 2024 Criminal Justice graduates that we received graduate data on, 100% reported being employed* after graduation.

Do you have an interest in criminal behavior and the justice system? Criminal justice students delve into the sociology behind criminal behavior for an understanding of why people break laws and how it influences society. Our program includes instruction in law enforcement, corrections, the legal system, criminology, inequality, violence, and victimization.

Students develop the problem-solving skills to be professional and ethical while learning how to appropriately handle a variety of challenging situations. With a degree in criminal justice, you will use research methods and scientific evidence to understand and control crime.

We incorporate internships into our curriculum to provide practical hands-on learning and a chance for our students to assess their career options. The Billings area is surrounded by an abundance of internship and career opportunities from the police force, court system, government services, addiction treatment centers, and correctional facilities.

Students showcase their original research projects in a supportive and professional setting at MSU Billings' annual Research and Creativity Conference. This gives students a chance to work with their faculty, to take the knowledge gained in classrooms, and share insights with the world around them.
