Out of the 33% of 2024 History graduates and the 63% of 2023 History Education graduates that we received graduate data on, 100% reported being employed* after graduation.

Overview of the History program:

In our history courses, students examine the discipline and methods of history in order to cultivate an appreciation for the past. The department offers a variety of courses in the areas of Early America, Modern U.S., the Ancient World and Archaeology, Early Modern and Modern Europe, Women's and Gender History and Global History.

Beyond preparing our students to become teachers, public historians, writers, archivists, lawyers, preservationists, and a whole lot of other things, the Department of History at MSU Billings offers students the chance to meet other amazing people and develop a real sense of community.
