Occupation	Annual Mean Wage in MT*	Potential Lifetime Earnings*
Mental Health Worker	\$39,400 - \$53,690	\$53,710 x 39 yrs = \$2,094,690
Social Worker, Child & Family	\$50,330 - \$62,670	\$63,770 x 39 yrs = \$2,487,030
Youth Case Manager	\$38,260 - \$49,330	\$53,940 x 39 yrs = \$2,103,660
Community Health Worker	\$46,530 - \$50,730	\$48,200 x 39 = \$1,879,800

Out of the 33% of 2024 Sociology graduates who responded to MSUB'S Graduate Survey, 100% reported being employed* after graduation.

Overview of the Sociology program:

Sociology is the study of social life and the social causes of human behavior. The sociologist's interests range from the intimate family to the hostile mob, from crime to religion, from race and social class to the shared beliefs of a common culture, from work to sports. Few fields have such a broad scope.

Sociology is a major for students interested in human interaction and the social world. Sociologists use systematic, evidence-based, scientific methods to interpret the behavior of individuals in the structure of organizations, families, communities, and societies. At MSU Billings, students are prepared with the tools to make sense of the social world, contribute solutions to difficult issues, and generate a more enlightened and effective social policy.

Our students learn valuable research skills to accompany the sociological perspective, which prepares them for a variety of career options. These careers include social services in governmental agencies, non- profit organizations, counseling, law enforcement, addiction treatment, probation and parole, market research, community development, and law.

What makes the MSU Billings Sociology program unique?

Students showcase their original research projects in a supportive and professional setting at MSU Billings' annual Research and Creativity Conference.
