Information/ Discussion

Purpose and Membership

As the first 'Jacket Leadership Team meeting of the academic year, and the first with new Provost Lee Vartanian in attendance, each person stated their name, department, and length of time at MSUB in their current or previous roles. Chancellor Hicswa read the purpose statement of 'Jacket Leadership Team. "The 'Jacket Leadership Team promotes shared governance by including a wide representation of departmental leaders in decision-making processes and the enacting of institutional priorities. It aims to enhance the university's mission, improve operational efficiency, and foster a collaborative environment that promotes academic excellence and student success."

Meeting Format and Agenda Items

To renew focus on the purpose of Jacket Leadership Team meetings, the group will discuss meeting agendas and formats at a future meeting this fall.

Commitments

Chancellor Hicswa announced that Dan Carter, Director of University Communications & Marketing, will chair a small work group with the goal of determining the "commitments" of being a member of 'Jacket Leadership Team. The committee will gather ideas from 'Jacket Leadership Team members, for example wearing nametags or not working on email during meetings. State of the University Address (August 21)

Chancellor Hicswa announced that the State of the University Address is on Thursday, August 21 and will feature a keynote speaker. Dr. Scott Finnie, a faculty member with whom she serves on the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) Board, will give the address. The event begins at 8:30 and is immediately followed by the "Where in the Hive" information fair. From 2:00 to 3:00, the virtual "Know the Nest" event will take place and features 10 presenters from different areas of campus. At 4:00, the Chancellor will host an open house at the Chancellor's Residence. Families are welcome.

Year 7 EIE Visit (October 8-10)

Kathleen Thatcher, Director of Assessment and Accreditation, announced that she submitted MSUB's Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness (EIE) Report to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities last week. This was the comprehensive report for the university's seven-year accreditation cycle. Kathleen is building the agenda for the Year 7 visit in cooperation with the chair of the evaluation team. Kathleen highlighted the importance of attending appropriate meetings during the visit. Kathleen reminded the team that the reviewers are peer evaluators who provide a helpful outside perspective. Chancellor Hicswa reminded the group to encourage students to attend sessions. It is important for the review team to hear from our students.


