Fellow Honors Programmers,

Belatedly, I am completing my update from the last newsletter. Several of you have asked about the Honors courses for next semester, and we will get more information our later in the week. But I include some information below.

- Capstone Course—As announced at our orientation, Curt Kochner will teach the pilot version of our capstone problem-solving course Honors 492/292 Food Distribution and Hunger in Billings. The course has 4 goals: 1) maximizing the use of food as a resource for those who need it, 2) reducing the cost of food for those in need, 3) reducing food waste, and 4) maximizing the use of food waste. For the participants, the course offers the chance to build up their problem solving and critical thinking skills by giving them a real world problem to work on. Juniors and seniors can take the course at the 492 level and freshmen and sophomores at the 292 level.
- Honors Writing 201—Although it is not on the schedule yet, we will offer an Honors section of Writing 201. Just as last year, we are planning to have a guest writer team teaching the course. Assuming for a second that we are successful, this could become one of our signature elements, i.e. the UHP guest writers course.
- Semesterly Meeting Reminder—If you haven't scheduled your meeting to go over your orientation writing assignment and to talk about your path through Honors, please do so.
- Justice Course—Molly Carty asked if it would be possible to offer a course on justice and, as the title of the book title she showed me asked, "What is the right thing to do?" It looks like Professor Ana Dias will offer a 1-credit course on the theme. If you are interested, let me know because the time would be determined by the availabilities of the participants.
- Goldwater Scholarship Representative—I have agreed to serve as MSUB's Goldwater Scholarship and was glad to do so, because working on such scholarships was one of my responsibilities at my previous institution, Clarkson University. In my last 12 years there, we had at least 1 awardee in each year and 19 in all. For students interested in pursuing prestigious scholarships, we want to build a program that will enable them to be competitive applicants.

That's it for now, but, as I have mentioned, we will get out updated information on course options for next semester later in the week.
