IoE Statewide Summer 2014 Undergraduate Internship Program

Deadline: Monday, March 10, 2014 - 5:00pm (Apply online)

The Montana Institute on Ecosystems (IoE) Statewide Summer Internship Program is accepting proposals for research projects in ecosystem science from undergraduates throughout the Montana University System and the Montana tribal colleges. Internships will be awarded for work in environmental areas with a priority for working on projects that focus on one of the following IoE/MT-EPSCOR research areas:

- 1. Feedbacks between microbial metabolism and ecosystem processes
- 2. Linkages between landscape patterns and ecosystem processes
- 3. Impacts of climate change on ecosystems through modeling, experimentation, and vulnerability assessments

Funding for the internship program comes from the Montana NSF EPSCoR grant (subject to continued project funding); awards are subject to satisfactory adherence to all <u>program rules and expectations</u>.

The application process is open to undergraduates from all MSU, UM, and Montana tribal college campuses who will not graduate before December 2014. Applications and supporting faculty mentor letters of recommendation are due by Monday, March 10. Awards will be announced by Monday, March 31.
