Dear Fellow Honors Programmers,

Welcome or welcome back! We are looking forward to seeing you at orientation and getting the Honors year underway. The candy dish and cookie jar are filled in preparation for your arrival. I will give you more details about the coming year at orientation (Wednesday, 4:00-7:00, September 3, Dining Room A&B), but here are some of the new and coming changes.

- ♦ New Assistant Jenay Cross joined us earlier this month, enabling us to hit the ground running this year. Jenay is a 2010 music grad from MSUB, who has previously taught high school in Wolf Point and worked at a savings and loan in Colorado. She will help us with one of our most important goals of the year, improving our communication with you and vice versa.
- ♦ On the Horizon We are hoping to have new space for the 2015-16 academic year, which will feature dedicated space for students, ideally a combination lounge/seminar room. There are a number of locations under consideration, and I will seek your advice on some of them at orientation.
- ♦ Our Courses All six of our Honors General Ed courses—the most ever!—have enrolled for the fall. We are planning on two new Honors General Education courses for the spring, HSTA 200, The Historian as Detective, and SOCI 101, Introduction to Sociology. There will also be at least two new Honors seminars for the spring, including the possibility of one featuring the Raspberry Pi computer.
- ♦ Contributing to the Community One of the functions of the UHP is to contribute to the campus and Billings community. One way in which we have tried to fulfill this function is by co-sponsoring the speaking series by guest writers and hosting the Honors writer in residence. This year we expect the speaking series to include 5 writers, including Craig Johnson whose Walt Longmire series became a series on A&E. At the orientation, we will want to consider other ways in which we can contribute to the intellectual and cultural climate of our community.
- ♦ Scholarships for UHP Students & Other Discussion Topics for Orientation Scholarships for all UHP students would be the biggest change in the program since I arrived, and there is much to talk about in terms of this possibility.

I look forward to seeing you at orientation or, if you can't attend, soon thereafter. As such changes as new honors space and scholarships indicate, there is much to anticipate, and your return to campus adds to our anticipations and our cheer.


WRITER IN RESIDENCE
