"We were very successful this year, our overall record was 11-4-2. We placed 2nd in the GNAC conference, making it to the GNAC conference tournament, but unfortunately got knocked out in the semi-finals. This year we became the 5th team in GNAC history to not let a team get a single shot off (against NNU at home), the first time since 2005. Personally, I started all but 3 of the 17 games this season with a total of 1058 total minutes this season. I had 2 assists (1 against SPU to Amanda Perri and 1 against CWU to Alisa Sagdahl) and 1 goal (assist from Jessica Spang). [...] I also received Great Northwest Athletic Conference academic all-conference honors with a 3.80 cumulative GPA. UMKC Study Abroad Programs

University of Missouri Kansas City is offering two summer study abroad programs that carry honors credit for any students who might be interested:

CORK, IRELAND

Honors students interested in a summer study abroad experience are encouraged to apply to the Ireland Study Abroad program sponsored by University of Missouri—Kansas City. This 4-week program, scheduled for June 2015, explores the interplay of history, literature, and culture in Ireland from the early-modern period to the present. This program includes 6 hours of honors credit and all students, regardless of residency, will pay in-state tuition. LYONS, FRANCE

During this 6-week program students earn 9 credits (all students pay instate tuition) and gain a deeper understanding and appreciation for the French language and culture. Along with innovative language and culture classes, students take an interdisciplinary course on the French Resistance during World War II with Dr. Gayle Levy, Honors Program Director.
