She earned her degree in Anthropology and History from the University of Massachusetts Boston and spent many years working as an archaeologist for the National Park Service in California, Wyoming, and Montana. After marrying a fifth-generation rancher from southeast Montana, Cindy served as a cultural resource manager at the Little Bighorn Battlefield while earning her Master's in Library and Information Science from San José State University, with a focus on digital archiving and emerging technologies. Most recently, Cindy spent four years revitalizing the library at a small middle and high school in Wyoming, where she also supported dual enrollment students.

Cindy champions the belief that libraries are for everyone. Her work has consistently centered on meeting patrons where they are and fostering the library as a welcoming, inclusive space—one that goes far beyond just books. She sees libraries as vital community hubs—places where people of all ages can explore new ideas, access resources, and build meaningful connections.




UPDATES AND INFO


