Physical Library Reserves

Given the uncertainties surrounding Covid-19, access to our print reserves will be suspended for the fall semester. To comply with sanitation guidelines of Library materials, print books and DVD's must be quarantined for 72 hours before others can use them, making these materials less accessible than usual. If you currently have print materials on reserve you want removed and returned to you or our collections, please contact <u>Chandra Shaw</u>.

We recommend assigning course materials that are available to students online. Some helpful strategies to support these efforts include:

- Share permalinks to any of the <u>e-books</u>, <u>articles</u>, <u>streaming media</u>, or other resources we have in <u>PowerSearch</u> or our <u>e-journals or databases</u>.
- Students can also order items (physical or electronic) via our <u>InterLibrary Loan</u> <u>service</u>, by searching over 1 billion items in more than 80,000 libraries worldwide in <u>WorldCat</u>. Shipping delays can occur – plan accordingly.
- Adopt, Adapt, or Create an Open Educational Resource (OER). We have a Lib-Guide with <u>suggestions for finding OERs</u>. A useful place to start is our video titled <u>Why Open Education Matters</u>.
- Explore the <u>MSUB Copyright and Fair</u> <u>Use LibGuide</u>.
- Seek the advice of your <u>liaison librarian</u>.
