LIBRARY INSTRUCTION

The MSU Billings Library provides high-quality library instruction sessions for all levels of MSUB courses. A member of our Instruction Team will tailor a session to fit the specific needs of your course and your students. In order for library staff to adequately prepare an instruction session please make your instruction request a minimum of one week in advance of when you would like the session to take place.

There are several different instructional models that are available. Depending on the circumstances, the number of students, room availability, and other factors your instruction session may be in-person in the Library, in-person in your classroom, virtually in your classroom, or virtually to students wherever they are. Each instruction request will be assessed by the faculty member and the librarian to determine the best mode of delivery.


YEP EXTENSION

The kiosks will automatically email you a receipt when you are finished. For faculty/staff, the default checkout period is for most library items is **one** calendar year.

The library now has access to an additional four magazine archives and a new database:


