#### I. ITEMS – FIRST READING

**Item 21** HADM 640 Epidemiology and Quality Health Care. Online only course. Change title.

**Item 21.a** HADM 607 Health Care Information Systems. New course—online only.

Deb Peters, Director of the Health Administration Program, noted that "quality" is being removed from the title of HADM 640, as quality health care themes run through the whole program, not just one course. She also noted that 607 was previously a workshop course that is now being converted to a regular course.

Tony Hecimovic noted that this course replaces a required internship. The problem with the internship was what kind of internship will work for each student. This course allows teachers who are currently teaching to still complete their degree without trying to fit an internship into their schedule.

- **Item 12.i** EDCI 675 Logic, Problem Solving, and Computer Programming for Education. Change title and prerequisites.

**Item 6** Master of Ed. Option in Early Childhood. Modification of an existing program. **Item 10.L** EC/SPED 521 Models of Early Intervention Services. New course. **Item 10.m** EC/SPED 526 Special Education Interventions and Adaptations for Children (0-6). New course.

Mary Susan Fishbaugh noted that these changes are intended to make the Early Childhood program more flexible. The program credit numbers remain the same, but some applied research courses and applied courses for teachers teaching teachers have been added. There are also more focus areas for students to choose from.

Dr. Fishbaugh noted that her department has two graduate programs in Special Education: Generalist and Advanced Studies. The department is adding to the Advanced Studies program to make it more stringent. These program changes are also in preparation for proposing doctoral programs in Reading and Special Education, which the department was encouraged to do by Geoff Gamble, President of MSU.

It was noted that this graduate program has been mostly "either/or" courses. Now they have hired a faculty member to teach this program, and there are changes as a result.

Voting on Items 16, 16.a, and 16.b will be postponed until December 4, and Steve Coffman, Chair of Communication and Theatre will be invited to attend that meeting.
