Steve Coffman noted that when the MSPR was proposed, the department did its best to create a program. The department has now hired a faculty member to teach this program, and the department is now aligning the program with national standards. The students will have three options to finish the program: a part for those already in the field; a *project* for young, inexperienced students; and a *thesis* for students who want to go on to a doctorate.

David Davison noted that the Master of Ed is losing its market because it is 62 credits, which is higher than most other institutions. At the request of the Graduate Student Association (GSA) and working with faculty, the total credits are being reduced to 52 as many of the courses are being combined into 4 credit courses. The combined courses are going to be team-taught. The changes will streamline the program and highlight integration of the courses, which was emphasized but not necessarily practiced.

It was noted that there will be about 20 to 25 students in a classroom for this program. It was also cited that most of the students in this program are non-traditional students who can handle a more streamlined, more intense program. It was noted that how the team teaching will work is not yet decided.

It was noted that the Praxis II test requires that students know the content before they can move forward in the program. The test works as a filtering process.

It was noted that several students have criticized the redundancy in the program, and this is an effort to eliminate that redundancy.

It was stated that if this streamlined program does not work out, the department will be back with changes.

It was noted that the GSA should be congratulated for making an effort to get involved and change something that was in need of change, rather than just leave things as they are.

IV. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEM

Item 22 Revision of General Education Program – Proposal from the Gen Ed Committee

It was noted that the Committee would like Senate approval of the work they have done so far, in order to continue that work. Some parts of this proposal may still change, but this will be the basic structure of general education. It was cited that the number of required credits for Gen Ed has not yet be settled, and the fine arts need to be added to the outcomes matrix

It was noted that part of the proposal is that students will not be able to double count their credits. If a course is used for Gen Ed, that same course cannot count toward a major as well.

It was decided that a vote on this Item will be postponed until the next Senate meeting, January 22, 2004.
