Dean Mary Susan Fishbaugh, College of Education, stated that they have had a master's program in curriculum and instruction K-8 for years, and over the years it became unmarketable as well as understaffed. The College has piloted a "teaching as a second career" program using the M.Ed. Interdisciplinary Studies program and they are now moving that pilot program into the current M.Ed. Curriculum and Instruction K-8 program. The credits are changing, but the changes do balance out.
