She also noted that OCHE is in the process of reimagining the program review process, because the Regents want to be in the process earlier. At the November BOR meeting, they agreed to make changes, but the plan for those changes has not yet been formed. So, we submitted a few new program plans, and those were rejected by Bozeman because the process is changing. After conferring with OCHE, the old process will still be followed until a new process is ready, so our program plans were accepted.
