## B. Identification and Announcement of Academic Foundations Courses to be Assessed in Spring 2007

It was agreed that all the Academic Foundations courses taught by full-time faculty (not part-time) next semester will be assessed.

It was noted that departments may ask to remove a few courses, especially if an instructor is teaching more than one of those courses. Faculty should not be asked to assess in more than one course.

It was noted that the second semester of the integrated sciences course (SCIN 103) is offered next spring, but it would probably not be appropriate for assessment. We would only be getting the second half of the course.

## C. Contacting and Working with Academic Foundations Working Groups

It was noted that there are still many questions about the assessment. It was noted that instructors can rate their students' results however they want, because those results can always be translated into a scale later.

It was cited that faculty can also develop assessments that are course specific, as long as they are assessing the objectives. They are probably already teaching the objectives in their classes anyway. All they have to do is focus on those objectives and how they are measured.

It was noted that there still aren't leaders for the Academic Foundations Working Groups. Oliver Chen agreed to lead Math

Jane Howell agreed to lead Information Literacy

Dan Gretch agreed to lead the Natural Sciences (Life and Physical)

Mark Hardt agreed to lead Social Sciences
