## Presiding: George Madden, Chair

Russ Lord and Carl Hanson of the Health, Physical Education, and Human Services Department stated that the changes above will result in one BS in Health and Human Performance with 3 options: Teacher Certification, Health Promotion, and Human Performance. There is a major core that all students must complete, and then they can continue in one or more options (hopefully student teachers will be able to take another option as well to broaden their field). It was also noted that these changes enable the department to cover all the required courses easier than they could before, and there is no net change in credits for the degree. There is no need for new faculty, and this degree will feed right into the proposed Master's in Athletic Training (not yet effective). It was also noted that the students in the Human Performance Option will be doing a senior thesis.

Susan Gregory noted that the Gen Ed credits were increased to 37, and they cut an HPE course in order to stay at 60 credits (a Board of Regents mandate for associates degrees). George Madden stated that the influence of the Federal Government on our programs is not good for us as a University. Mary Susan Fishbaugh, Chair of Special Education, Counseling, Reading, and Early Childhood, stated that she agreed with Dr. Madden. The "No Child Left Behind" Act is regimented and punitive in the way it's written. The changes to this degree do not respond to the punitiveness of the act.
